# A New Building Campaign

One summer, while traveling in Montana, I noticed several signs posted along our route listing the Ten Commandments. I've always wondered why the Ten Commandments were so prominent, while the commandments that Christ gave us were nowhere to be seen. Why not, "love your God with all your heart, mind, and soul," and "you shall love your neighbor as yourself" on a sign? The message could be shortened to, "Love God: love your neighbor," and written in letters big and bold enough to blast the retinas of the speediest of drivers.

In our congregation we're pretty good at loving God. We show up for Sunday services, take communion, pray and sometimes even read the Bible on our own time. Recently we organized a campaign to build a new sanctuary for worship. We found extra money in our budgets, and extra time in our day to paint and hammer. It's a testament to our love for God. But how good are we at the second of Christ's commandments?

Maybe it's time to start another building campaign; one to build a framework within our sanctuary of love for one another. It would be far harder than raising a roof or nailing some boards together. It means that we shift our focus and work for the good of each other first, and the good of the church second. What follows from that will truly benefit our church. It requires treating the woman across the

aisle as gently as a piece of Chihuly glass; the man in the choir as if he were our best friend;. to give the committee chairperson the same consideration, kindness, and forgiveness that we would want for ourselves. To build this, every person has to look into the core of their belief and make a decision to build. *Love God: love each other*. We could write it in our hearts in letters big enough to blast the soul of the worst doubter. You might say it's impossible, but I say let's try. As Christians, we must.

We're in the process of making changes in the way we run the church. We've started a finance committee, a mutual ministry committee, and we're drafting a new constitution and by-laws. But if we do these things without love, what will we gain? Paul has the answer in his famous essay in first Corinthians. Without love we are nothing but a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. God's work is out there awaiting our joyful participation. But first we need to make sure we're not just clanging around.


# Thursday Morning Bible Study
