Seas of Change

We live in a world that is filled with change. Some changes are expected like the drip of rain and the lash of the wind in a Northwest winter. And, other changes come as a complete surprise leaving us to grasp about in an attempt to regain our bearings. Whether we welcome changes or not, they persist in coming.

At OSLC, we have become increasingly aware of the seas of change that swirl around us. A few changes we may recognize as expected or even welcome but many of them have caused confusion and doubt. We look around for something to save us from the waters that have begun to swamp our boats. Lower levels of giving, changes in staffing, uncertainty about the needs or perspectives of those new to our community; all of these things swirl and press and expose the smallness of our faith.

There is an old story told by the founder of the Methodists, John Wesley, about his

own experience of faith in the midst of change. As the story goes, he was a young pastor who was sent as a missionary by the Church of England to convert Native Americans in Georgia to Christianity. With high hopes, he went and fervently preached the gospel. And to his great despair, nothing happened. His attempts at conversion were a complete failure. Accepting defeat, he boarded a ship and headed back to England.

Mid-way across the Atlantic, a heavy storm pounded the ship and it nearly capsized. Wesley was terrified of the storm and feared for his life. And, it was in that moment that he realized that he did not truly believe the gospel that he had been preaching to others. Looking around, he noticed a group of Moravians (a close cousin of the Lutheran church) who were calmly gathered in prayer trusting in God's grace in the midst of the storm.

Three years after Wesley arrived safely back in England, he writes the following after attending a small Moravian church on Aldersgate Street in London:

In the evening, I went very unwilling to a society in Aldersgate Street where one was reading Luther's "Preface" to the Epistle to the Romans. About a quarter before nine, while he was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt that I did trust in Christ, Christ alone for salvation, and an assurance was given me, that he had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death.

In the midst of troubling seas of change, John Wesley recognized the faith that he longed for in the words and actions of others, and seeing that faith he was not afraid to go out and embrace it. Lacking a sincere faith of his own, he opened his heart and allowed it to be strangely warmed by the witness of others.

Wesley's example is a very helpful one for us, here at OSLC, in our own time. Sometimes our faith is ragged and our hopes are dim. Sometimes it is simply true that we are tired and confused and our faith is small. When we doubt, we are called to turn to the witness of others who can help awaken the sleeping Jesus who rests peacefully in our boat. We are not alone, and there are peaceful seas yet to be sailed.

Facing seas of change in our own community, do we have the courage to open up to one another and wake our Lord? There are conversations to be had, and there is work to be done. In this season of light, we are called to walk with one another and to let the love of Christ warm our hearts.

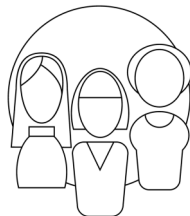

Prayer Shawl Ministry Meeting

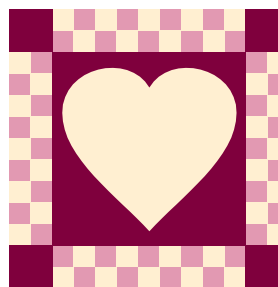

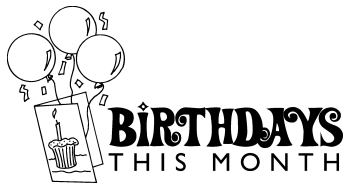
2011 Nominating Committee

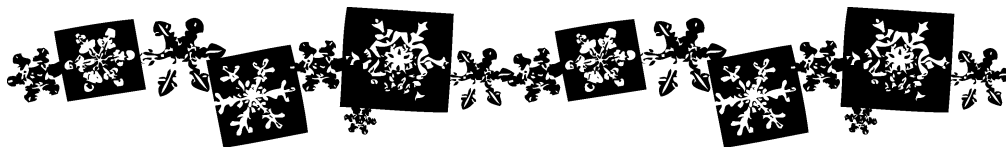
