The people of God have a song to sing. Or ring. Or play. Or dance. Or speak, murmur or pray.

It's easy to think of the musicians of our congregation as the ones we see leading in worship on a regular basis – but really, we are all musicians. We all contribute to the song of the people.

This Lent, we saw the return of the singing of the Psalm in Sunday morning worship. There's hardly a better expression of the song of the people in scripture than the Psalms. All the themes of a life of faith are there, comingled in a frequently untidy, sometimes exuberant, always passionate way. God's great acts of mercy are recalled and celebrated, the yearnings, disappointments, fears and frustrations of the people are often front and center, and God's praises are proclaimed – again and again.

In the life of our congregation, this has been quite the year for singing our song. Songs old and new were part of the rhythms and rituals of the liturgical year.

We sang the song of commemoration, for the reformers and departed saints of our faith's formation. We sang the song of reconciliation, for God's healing at work in our community. We sang the song of celebration, for 50 years of God's faithfulness in our midst. We sang the song of contemplation, for the renewing days of Lent. We sang the song of mourning, for the members of our church family who died. We sang the song of jubilation, for the assurance of the risen Christ's presence in our lives. And still the song is sung. In days of want and days of plenty, days in the wilderness and days on the mountain top, days when we can barely recall the words and days when the tune flows freely, the song is sung – again and again.

As interim choir director, I am grateful to have had the opportunity to sing the

Treasurer's Update

April 2011

First, I would like to thank everyone for contributing to the "Extra Month" campaign. Through April, this has raised \$22,232. We are almost at our goal of \$25,000. This is helping to reduce our YTD giving shortfall (see below).

We are 10 months (83%) through our fiscal year.

What has actually happened this year:

We have received YTD - (92% of operations budget) \$ 367,477 *

We have spent YTD - (89% of operations budget) \$ 345,891

Deficit - We have spent more than received \$ 21,586

Compared to what we budgeted:

We are behind budgeted giving by \$ 20,773

We are under budgeted spending by \$ 41,715

Compared to last year's actual:

Our contributions were less than last year by \$ 22,104 *

DID YOU KNOW?

About Hammond House?

There are many "hidden" ministries at OSLC, activities that people have taken upon themselves to show the compassion of Christ to the needy. If your heart feels drawn to helping, give these secret angels a call or click.

It's the third Sunday of the month and Marilyn Larson is fixing breakfast at Hammond House in downtown Seattle. Hammond House, the overnight shelter for women operated by the Compass Center, has room for forty homeless women, and they are almost always full. Although the women can only stay the night and must leave during the day, at Hammond House they have a private storage locker, a bed, showers, and dinner.

Because the kitchen space is small, Marilyn finds it is more comfortable and efficient to have only three volunteers at a time with her. Usually Ingeborg Nims goes with her, and it would be great to have at least another one or two.

Sharing the cost as a donation, the volunteers spend about \$60-\$65 a month to serve a breakfast of scrambled eggs, turkey sausage, grits, fruit, cheese, fruit juice, milk, and some variety of toast, muffins, scones, etc. They found that variety is not necessary; the women are so appreciative of fresh food prepared just for them.

For some, Hammond House is transitional housing. For others who have some form of mental illness, Hammond House is their home. Most of the women, perhaps 80%, have been spending every night at Hammond House for 8-10 years, if not more.

Marilyn and her team also deliver hotel toiletries collected by our congregation members for distribution at Hammond House. We've also taken clothing and shoes and, when Marie Rice was with us, she donated boxes of new sweatshirts from the company where she worked. From time to time, you will see several Compass Center/Hammond House collection events at OSLC.

*Would **you** like to help? Drop women's toiletries, clothes, socks and underwear in the boxes opposite the library. Contribute breakfast groceries or money to buy them.*

Rwanda...just the sound of the word conjures up all kinds of reactions: thoughts of distance, tragedy, renewal, forgiveness, hope. Rwanda is all these things and many of our congregation have taken a sincere interest in its present and future. Some are working closely with its people to learn more and to help in keeping Rwanda's hope alive. Many of us are interested in learning more...are you one of them? A book has been donated to the library entitled *A Thousand Hills* and tells the story of "Rwanda's rebirth and the man who dreamed it".

That man is Paul Kagame who began as a bitterly angry student, who organized a secret revolutionary army that waged a war to stop a genocide, who changed the course of the nation and "set in motion one of the most exciting social and political experiments now underway anywhere in the world."

A Thousand Hills was written by Stephen Kinzer, an award-winning foreign correspondent who has worked in more than fifty countries. A comment about this book reads, "What a fascinating tale! What an inspiration! The courage and triumph of Paul Kagame show the beauty of reconciliation and of transcendent leadership. The world needs to learn his lessons, and Stephen Kinzer's brilliant narrative will help make this enlightenment possible."

PERU MISSION TRIP 2011

As we indicated previously, our Lutheran brothers and sisters in Chiclayo have invited us to send a mission team! Henrik and Patty Christopherson - long-time members of OSLC, veteran missionaries in Chiclayo, and highly experienced mission trip guides - have offered to shepherd us on this trip, greeting us at the airport in Lima and guiding us every step of the way.

The proposed dates for this trip are October 5th through October 17th. There will be an optional excursion at the end of the trip, which would add a few days (and an undetermined cost) for those interested. This excursion would leave from Lima, so that those not interested can easily and safely return home on the 17th. Details of the excursion will depend on group interest; Machu Picchu has been a popular destination for previous mission trips.

This will be a working trip, and the cost is estimated at \$500 plus airfare (and any optional excursion costs). An intrepid spirit, a good sense of humor, and a love of Christ and neighbor are highly recommended for those wanting to come along.

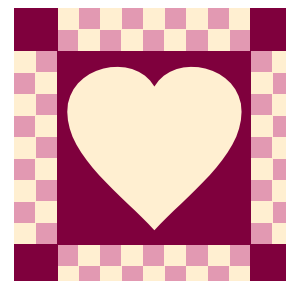
We meet the first Sunday of every month between services to bless newly completed shawls and to hand out yarn.

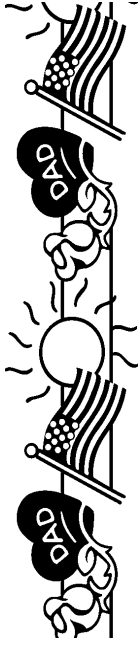
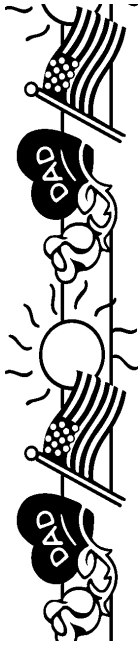
