Get in on What God is Doing by Pastor Larry Thomas

My earliest memories of church are of people in a building singing, praying, and listening to the preacher. As a child, our family attended the First Baptist Church of Van Nuys, California. We sang and prayed, and the preacher preached. I was baptized at a July, 1955 Sunday night service at First Baptist. My mother loved that church, but my father was unhappy with some of the legalism he experienced there, so our family left that church and joined another one: Boerea Chapel. Borea "chapel" met in a Moose Lodge Hall in Burbank, California. We sang and prayed and the preacher preached, just like First Baptist. I loved that church; my experience of gracious and loving adults who cared for me was formative to my childhood experience of church. Sadly, the leaders of Boerea Chapel decided to close the church and we had to find another one. We ended up at Emmanuel Lutheran Church in North Hollywood, California. I'm sitting at my desk writing to you thanks to the Christ-centered, grace-filled ministry of Emmanuel Lutheran Church. The worship life and ministry to people of all ages was life changing for me.

Lutherans believe in something called "The Means of Grace." The means of grace are the ways, the means, that God works in and through the Word, the Sacraments, and, the mutual conversation and consolation of our brothers and sisters in Christ to strengthen us in faith, hope, and love. Week in and week out we gather for worship on Sunday mornings. Like Christians of every time and place, we sing

and pray and listen to the preacher. Nourished by the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper, we depart forgiven and free. Following worship, we talk, we listen, we share. As trust grows and we feel free to share our pain and sorrow, joys and laughter with others, we experience the precious grace of life in Christ. At our best, our worship and fellowship make it possible for us to follow Jesus and share God's love in word and deed.

This week I finished reading *Practice Resurrection: A Conversation on Growing Up in Christ,* by Eugene Peterson. (Eerdmans, 2010) I've underlined and highlighted hundreds (thousands?) of lines. This excerpt on church and worship really spoke to me: *In acts of worship, the Holy Spirit internalizes himself in us and makes us "insider" participants in the Father's work of creation and the Son's work of salvation. In the act of worship, we deliberately remove ourselves from our workaday world of assignments and responsibilities and relationships, we assume a posture of not-doing--sitting, kneeling, folding our hands in prayer, lifting our arms in praise-and we invite the Holy Spirit to form in us the life of love and holiness that makes us one with the Father and the Son, which, we are assured, the Spirit is more than ready to do. We don't have to do anything, at least not in the way we are accustomed to doing things. But we do need to be present, attentive, receptive. We want to be in on what God is doing.*

September is an opportunity for fresh starts and new beginnings. I invite you to prayerfully consider how you might enrich your life and our life together as you share yourself and your gifts in and through worship, learning, service, witness, and fellowship. Get in on what God is doing.






