



#### **Council Quarterly Report**

As part of our continuing communication to the congregation, as council secretary I will be submitting a quarterly addition to the Focus which will include passed motions and decisions made by the council. This third installment covers July, September and October. (There was no regular August Council meeting)

#### **Passed Motions:**

- Appoint Gerrie Hendrickson as Youth ministry council member.
- Randy Halter and Janet Heck (on behalf of OSLC) enter into a new copier lease agreement pending the final contract review which will be a cost benefit to OSLC.
- Approve Janet Heck filling the position of Focus Editor as recommended and documented in item 1 section C of Shari's Lundberg's personnel report.
- Council member Barbara Extract appoint a committee to evaluate all forms of communication to OSLC congregation and community.
- Council grant Pastor Thomas request for three month sabbatical January March 2012.
- Commit to a \$1000 donation to Tent City 4 project. (\$750 from benevolence discretionary fund and \$250 from pastor's discretionary fund).
- Council designated funds (up to \$2,000) will be used to purchase a replacement computer for Pastor Ryan. This will be an apple laptop computer and owned by OSLC. (Pastor Ryan has been using his own personal computer since he has been at OSLC.)

#### **Decisions Made:**

- August council meeting will be dedicated to the continued work with Randy Baseler and the STP (Situation Target Proposal) and goal setting. Attendance is optional.
- September council meeting will focus on Pr. Eldon's report / recommendations and the book "Healthy Congregations."
- Meeting minutes from July were accepted as written.
- There were no objections to take \$1,000 from the Lenten Services Fund to support the October Peru mission for on the ground needs. (materials and bus transportation)
- There were no objections of using money from the council discretionary fund to replace choir director's computer as soon as possible.
- Approved request from Care Center next to OSLC to use Anderson Hall as a staging area for residents in case of an emergency where evacuation of the Care Center is required. (example: Gas leak within their facility)
