


### On Camp Lutherwood from Tommy Zhu-Sordahl, OSLC Middle Schooler

This summer, Pastor Ryan, some Middle school students and other kids from OSLC went to Lutherwood. It was very fun. When I was there, I learned a lot about what is in the Bible. I stayed in a cabin with a counselor who had an unusual name along with kids of my same age group. We stayed as a group for the whole week.



During the week when we were not studying, we participated in some fun activities. One activity was climbing a vertical playpen (an obstacle that goes up and down where you try to get to get to the top using logs, ropes, and bars). There was a wood platform at the top. Also, we swam at the Lake Samish waterfront. It was good to have many friends there, and I met some kids from around this area and beyond. I cannot wait until I go there again.



## On the National Youth Gathering from Taylor Usselman, OSLC High Schooler

The Youth Gathering in New Orleans was really inspiring and motivational. I was amazed by how many youth joined together to help out in so many ways. Watching the speakers with 33,000 plus people really changes you. I loved Pastor Nadia Bolz-Weber's speech the first night at the Superdome explaining how her life was changed. She described Lutherans as "unicorns" and I think that stuck in everyone's head. Her speech told me its okay to be

different and God will use you no matter who you are. I was also moved by one other speaker, Shane Claiborne, who said he was arrested for feeding the homeless and sleeping in parks at night. Not only were the speakers amazing but I loved the songs we got to sing. They made me want to get up and dance with everyone and savor every moment of it.

One of the last things that really surprised me was the youth. I remember waiting in line to exit the Superdome and our group was lined up next to a covered fence that stood randomly in the hall. Other church groups lined up on the other side and suddenly you would see people sticking their hands up over the fence for a high-five. You didn't know who was there but it didn't matter. We high-fived each other and gave one another little gifts like change, key rings, mints, etc. No one cared who was on the other side. That made me really happy to see everyone join together even if we were complete strangers. The whole trip has made me want to do more in my community and it has helped me find out more about the person I am.


### OSLC To Launch 'End Malaria in 2015' Campaign

Sunday, September 16

OSLC's Global Mission Team will launch our "End Malaria in 2015" Campaign on Sunday, September 16th. Dianne Johnson, Associate in Ministry at Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Renton will be our special guest. Ms. Johnson has traveled to Tanzania many times and led an excellent presentation on ending malaria at the May 2012 NW Washington Synod Assembly. Ms. Johnson will lead a forum on malaria at 9:45 a.m. and do a temple talk at both of our worship services.

Every 60 seconds a child dies from malaria, a disease that is both preventable and curable. (Malaria is a life threatening disease carried by a parasite. It is transmitted to people through bites of malaria-carrying mosquitoes.) Approximately half of the world's population is at risk for malaria. Worldwide, there are more than 200 million cases of malaria each year and of those infected, nearly a million die. Most malaria cases and deaths occur in sub-Saharan Africa.

The Lutheran Malaria Initiative (LMI) is a partnership of Lutheran World Relief and The Lutheran Church-Missouri synod together with Lutheran congregations across North America. The goal is to raise \$45 million in a global effort to end malaria deaths in Africa by 2015. LMI is made possible through support from the United Nations Foundation. Building on the success and strength of networks already in place, the mission in Africa is straightforward: to teach people to recognize the symptoms of malaria, promote prevention and provide treatment and prevention resources. OSLC is excited to be a part of The Lutheran Malaria Initiative.



The mission of OSLC's End Malaria in 2015 Campaign is to educate OSLC members and friends about the devastating impact of malaria in sub-Saharan Africa and to provide opportunities through prayer and financial support to participate in efforts to save lives and improve the well being of millions of children and adults through education and the delivery of medical treatment and prevention resources. To this end, our goal (which we hope to robustly exceed!) is to raise \$2,500 to purchase treated bed nets (at \$10 each) between now and May, 2013. Thanks in advance for your prayers and support of our efforts to End Malaria in 2015. Buy a net, save a life!


