Praise ye the Lord for our increased attendance and giving. For our fiscal year beginning July 1 through November 30, our average attendance at Sunday services has increased by almost 7% over the same period last year, our giving by almost 17%, and our income has exceeded our expenses by \$5,800.

Praise ye the Lord for our social concerns committee who supervised the Thanks-giving delivery of food to 60 individuals from 21 families; for their work on the Christmas giving program (no numbers are available at this writing); for global missions' leadership in the anti-malaria campaign, which has met its cash goal with 4 1/2 months yet to go; for the successful yard clean up organized by building and grounds, and the completion of much needed caretaker residence repairs.

Praise ye the Lord for our youth and the adults who oversee and plan their activities including those that are more sacred, such as compline and a possible mission trip, to the just plain fun such as whirly ball and nerf night. For musicians who inspired our

When a House Becomes a Home

You have probably heard about Compassion House. But you may not know too much about it. Or about how OSLC is involved. It is quite a story.

There is a desperate need on the part of homeless single moms and their children who come from backgrounds (often generations) of abuse. Mark Miller, the pastor of Mountain Creek Christian Fellowship, felt called to do something about it. Pastor Miller and his wife, Beth, are the hands and feet and heart of this very well run organization. But they know they can't do it by themselves, and so they have involved other churches in town. With Pastor Larry's blessing, OSLC has become a part of the ministry, a project that involves much more than providing these families with just housing.

Most of these moms and children have never known "normal." They haven't experienced men who are responsible and caring. They don't know how to be these things themselves because they have never seen it modeled.

So what does a team do? They literally come alongside with help, compassion and friendship to guide a homeless mom trying to get all aspects of her life—and her kids—on a positive track. We work with them to resolve difficult issues regarding:

- **Finances** what does it take to support a family, how to budget and spend wisely.
- **Employment** how to access what they can do, write a resume, present effectively at an interview, maintain a job once it is obtained and balance employment with child care.
- **Transportation**—they may not have a car. Or a bike that works. How to do shopping, medical trips, getting kids to school, etc.
- Legal custody, restraining orders, dealing with kidnapping, etc.
- Counseling and Support Each family is provided with professional counseling free of charge to both the mother and the children (separately). Many of the kids suffer PTSD, have anger issues, etc. They're unable to respond normally after what they have been through.
- **School and Tutoring**—many of these children are way, way behind their grade level and need help to attend and succeed in school
- Housekeeping, Meal Preparation, etc.
- Spiritual Development
- Parenting and Nurturing of Children

- Health, Nutrition, Caring for a Sick Child
- Medical Insurance
- Future Housing—when these moms are able to function productively and support themselves and their children, Compassion House will help them to find affordable housing

To benefit from the program, the mothers sign an agreement to meet the requirements: they must be free of drugs, alcohol and other detrimental activities. They must agree to do their part, with our help and guidance, in rebuilding their lives.

Team members commit to remain with a family until they move out and help in ways they can—or find people who know how. It might be fixing a broken bicycle so a child can get to school. It might be transportation to a doctor or grocery shopping. It might be taking a boy fishing or on a bike ride and providing healthy male companionship. It might be showing a woman how to organize a household. Whatever is needed, the ultimate goal is to show what friendship is and encourage movement in a positive direction.

Thanks to donations from the City of Issaquah, private individuals, building companies, churches, and others, there are now three Compassion Houses. Three houses with three families, each comprising a single mom with multiple children. For each family, there is a team of seven or more volunteers coming alongside to guide and help. I am leading one team of volunteers from OSLC for the two years our family can remain at Compassion House.


OSLC Members: You Are Invited to Nominate a Candidate for Bishop

Nomination Period: November 16, 2012—February 16, 2013

You are invited to participate in the Northwest Washington Synod process to elect our next Bishop at the May 16-18, 2013 Northwest Washington Synod Assembly. (The new Bishop will serve a six year term beginning August 1, 2013.)

Any ordained minister of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is eligible to be elected as Bishop. There are no further requirements or limitations. The nominee is not required to be roster in our synod or to reside in our synod's geographical boundaries.

The nomination period is November 16, 2012 - February 16, 2013. As a member of an ELCA congregation in the NW Washington Synod, you may nominate a candidate for bishop during this time. Copies of the nomination form, together with additional information is available from the OSLC church office. A New Vision Statement for Our Savior Lutheran Church

In July 2012, OSLC's Long Range Planning Committee began work on reviewing OSLC's vision and mission statements and guiding principles. Early on there was a consensus that while the mission statement "worked," the vision statement needed some revising. A primary goal of the committee was to create a one sentence vision statement that "summarizes our sense of God's call and invitation to OSLC that is both a stretch for us and focuses on the future."

Each committee member prepared a draft vision statement that was reviewed and discussed by the committee. As we worked, we were mindful of the differences between mission statements and vision statements.

As committee member Justin Ulland wrote: "A mission statement defines the organization's purpose and primary objectives...Vision statements also define the organization's purpose, but they do so in terms of the organization's values rather than bottom line measures. The vision statement communicates both the purpose and values of the organization."

A vision statement outlines where we want to be; a mission statement talks about how we will get to where we want to be. The vision statement answers the question, "Why are we here?" The mission statement answers the question, "What do we do?"

In November 2012, the Long Range Planning Committee presented our drafts of a new vision statement, a slightly revised mission statement, and guiding principles to the Church Council for review. The committee went back to work and presented the final draft of a new vision statement for Our Savior Lutheran Church to the Church Council in December, 2012. Here's the OSLC Church Council approved version of OSLC's new vision statement:

We are a community called and empowered by the Spirit to boldly proclaim God's love and the good news of Jesus Christ, growing disciples who diligently and actively strive for peace, justice and healing in all the world.

We are grateful to the Church Council for their support of our work. Our hope and prayer is that our vision statement, mission statement (we'll review that in February *Focus*) and our guiding principles (we'll review them in the March *Focus*) will lay a solid foundation for long range planning for OSLC mission and ministry. I'm thankful for the faithful and diligent work of our Long Range Planning Committee Members: Randy Baseler, Lori Downey, Mary Ann Hult, John Stamm, and Justin Ulland.


