### **Practicing Resurrection**

In her book, *Practicing Resurrection*, Nora Gallagher recalls a conversation she had with her friend Harriet who told her about sitting in a worship service at the National Cathedral in Washington.

During the course of a boring sermon, the priest asked the congregation, "Now what do you really want for Christmas this year?" "I nearly rose from my pew," Harriet told Nora, "I was gathering myself up until I looked over at my sister who was giving me 'That Look' and I sat back down. What I wanted to do was stand up and call out, 'I would really like to believe in the resurrection.'"

Christians from around the world will gather in cathedrals and store fronts, chapels and meeting halls, churches and homes to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday, March 31st.

Easter Sunday worshippers will greet each other with the timeless words, "Alleluia, he is risen, he is risen indeed!" Easter Sunday worship services will feature Easter announcements, proclamations and alleluias galore. Festive hymns will be sung, anthems will be offered, prayers will be prayed, holy gospel accounts of the resurrection of our Lord will be read and sermons will be preached.

A two course meal of bread and wine, Holy Communion, the Lord's Supper, the Eucharist, will be served up and the faithful, the not so sure, and even the doubting will be welcomed with the good news promise that is served with the meal: the body of Christ, given for you; the blood of Christ, shed for you. What's implied, and God-willing known, by the communicants and the just-here-for-the-blessing guests at the table is that the "for you" also carries the words – "the cross was for you," the empty tomb is for you," and "new life is for you." While it's not all about you; it was all *given for* you.

Every Lord's Day Sunday worship service is a celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord. Even during Lent. (Those five Sundays in Lent are not "of Lent." They are a Lenten breather; a Lenten way station; a Lenten oasis.) Every announcement of forgiveness, every proclamation of the good news of Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, and every Lord's Supper, is a celebration of new life that is ours in Christ.

Our Easter Sunday celebrations remind us of the gospel truth that like a red thread winds its way through every Sunday worship service, every summer Camp Fire worship service, every Lenten midweek Holden Evening Prayer service, every Christmas Eve service, every Maundy Thursday and Good Friday service, every funeral and memorial service and every service of marriage: God loves you with unending and undying gracious and forgiving tender mercies. New life is yours every moment, every minute, every hour, every day, for all eternity.

On Easter Sunday, we will formally confess our faith in Jesus Christ crucified and risen. In unison, either from memory or reading the words printed in the service folder, we say that we believe "In Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord...who suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again..."

In his *Small Catechism*, Martin Luther explains the meaning of our confession: "I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, Son of the Father from eternity, and true man, born of the Virgin Mary—is my Lord. At great cost he has saved and redeemed me, a lost and condemned person. He has freed me from sin, death, and the power of the devil—not with silver or gold, but with his holy and precious blood and his innocent suffering and death."

Sisters and brothers in Christ – Easter is now - believe in the resurrection. After all, it's the gospel truth! Trust the good news promise that you are free in Christ to live the gift of your precious, cherished life. Practice resurrection – live into the new life that is yours and ours in Christ. We are Easter people. Resurrection is now. Today. Not just on Easter Sunday and not just on any Sunday. Every day is a gift of new life. Every day is Easter.

At the heart of the Maundy Thursday liturgy is Jesus' institution of the Holy Communion and his commandment to love one another. As Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, we are called to follow his example as we care for one another and for the poor and the unloved. At the Lord's Table we remember Jesus' sacrifice of his life, even as we are called to offer ourselves in love for the life of the world.

### **Good Friday Worship Service**

At the heart of the Good Friday liturgy is the passion according to John, which proclaims Jesus as a triumphant king who reigns from the cross. The ancient title for this day--the triumph of the cross--reminds us that the church gathers not to mourn this day but to celebrate Christ's life-giving passion and to find strength and hope in the tree of life. In the ancient bidding prayer we offer petitions for all the world for whom Christ died.

### Resurrection of our Lord—Easter Day Worship

March 31st at 8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.

Jesus is risen! He is risen indeed! On the first day of the week God began creation, transforming darkness into light. On this, the "eighth day" of the week, Jesus Christ was raised from the dead. We celebrate this new creation in the waters of baptism and in the feast of victory. With great joy we celebrate this day of days, even as we begin the great fifty days of Easter. Filled with hope, we go forth to share the news that Christ is risen! *Please note*,
