### Are You Weary?

Jesus' word to tired disciples:

"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Matthew 11:28

On those who follow God's law:

They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither.

In all that they do, they prosper. Psalm 1:3

"Come to me, all you that are weary..." How sweet are those words from Jesus in Matthew 11:28. From road weary commuters to homework weary teens, we can all relate to the overwhelming busyness and fatigue of our lives. Stepping back from it all, it is really quite amazing to think that from elementary school kids to golden years retirees our lives are so regularly filled with stress and weariness. No matter what our age or stage, life can burden us and beat us down.

For disciples of Jesus, there is a clear answer given to our tired groans and cries. Compared to last year's actual giving, our contributions were \$60,074 more than last year. We have also been blessed by contributions of \$190,247 for specific designated projects, e.g., the kitchen, new furnaces and many other wonderful designated projects.

### **OSLC Kitchen Remodel**

Mission of the church kitchen:

The purpose of the kitchen is to provide food, beverage and hospitality for events including: wedding and funeral receptions, Sunday coffee hour, full meals for up to 150 people, and other gatherings.

The walls are up! If you have been looking through the newly created window into the kitchen space, you will see new walls. Electrical and plumbing have all been installed. While the inspections have been done, there is still some electrical work

to be completed. We praise Jesus that no major issues were uncovered with the old wiring, but we have had to do more work than was in the original plan. A new panel has been placed in Anderson Hall, with new wiring to code, resulting in additional costs for permits and labor. Our costs to date are approximately \$96,000.00. We are approximately half way through the project itself. We are approximately eight weeks behind the original plan timeline, due to electrical and plumbing delays from permitting and inspection requirements. Anticipated completion would now be June 11, 2013 with the re-timing

OSLC sweat equity for primer and paint was accomplished on April 26 and 27. Now that the painting is complete we will see the kitchen take shape as the cabinetry is installed and counter tops take form. Continued prayers are requested for the safety and skills of all involved in this project.


