The Checkout Clerk and Her Tattoo

The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Galatians 5:22

True confession: This probably won't come as a big surprise to you but I don't have any tattoos or body piercings. Zero. Nada. Some folks might say it's a generational thing but the truth of the matter is that there are guys my age who wear an earring or two and/or have tattoos. Once in a while I'll joke about getting a tattoo but chances are I won't. But I have thought about it. Really.

When I think about getting a tattoo, I think about the checkout clerk and her tattoo. A few summers back, Pastor Fletcher and I preached a summer series of sermons based on one verse in St. Paul's Letter to the Galatians. It was verse 22 of chapter 5: The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Until that summer preaching series, I didn't know it was possible to preach nine sermons on one verse, but that's what we did. It can be done. But, I digress.

One Sunday morning after preaching a sermon on the fruit of the spirit, I stopped by the Front Street Market to pick up some groceries. The checkout clerk was someone I didn't recognize. She was a friendly twenty-something young woman with some piercings and a tattoo. On her forearm. To my mind it was very cool ink. She had filled up her left forearm with the words of Galatians 5:22; that's right, her tattoo read: *The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gener-*

osity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Galatians 5:22. I love this kind of winsome coincidence. I preach a sermon on Galatians 5:22 and the next thing I know I'm looking at Galatians 5:22 on the forearm of a checkout clerk at Front Street Market.

I didn't say anything about her tattoo until the next time I was at Front Street Market. I complimented the checkout clerk on her tattoo and she graciously thanked me. I saw her once or twice after that and that was it. I think about the checkout clerk and her tattoo every now and then and I wonder: Why did she tattoo Galatians 5:22 on her left forearm? Was it a reminder of some kind? A way to help her remember and never forget who she was and how she wanted to live her life as a child of God and a disciple of Jesus?

When I ask myself that question, that sets me to thinking about my own life as a disciple of Jesus: What do I need to remember and never forget about what matters most to me, to God, and to others? Once I've figured that out, should I tattoo that on my forearm so that it is always there for me and all to see? Do I want that kind of personal/public accountability?

What I think about when I think about my personal mission statement tattoo is a simple on my left wrist barely readable tattoo that reads: P.W.I.P. That's shorthand for "Practice What I Preach." It's a reminder to me that what I do should matter just as much as what I say. Preachers, or at least this preacher, needs to remember to practice what I preach. When I remember to practice what I preach I am able to re-focus myself pretty quickly on what matters most in any given situation. It's bracing and invigorating to have a clear sense of purpose and personal mission.

Let me be clear: I'm not advocating tattoos or planning on getting one anytime soon. But when I think about tattoos, I always think about the checkout clerk and her tattoo. I think about the fruit of the spirit, and then I think about those four words: Practice What I Preach. (P.W.I.P.) Let's say you and me were going to get a temporary tattoo, one that would wash off with a little soap and water. What words would you want on your forearm? I think I know what mine would be: P.W.I.P. What about you? What matters most to you? What do you think matters most to God? What would the ink on your forearm say? What would you like to remember and never forget. It's something to think about, doncha think?


Treasurer's Update




Summer Sunday Morning Worship Services @ 9:30 a.m.

I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. (Phi 1:3-6)

Thank you does not seem to do it. I keep saying it and the reality of all that we have done together means I need to say it again. I do appreciate the variety of the expressions of love and thanksgiving that were part of the Synod Assembly. The event on Thursday evening was memorable and much appreciated. To see the variety of people from various places around the synod and the church makes me appreciate the unique view which this office has granted me to see what God is up to in this synod.

My memories of that night will always contain the singing of the choir and the congregation. Lutherans do know how to sing. When we get together the joyful noise of God's people gives hope and joy to those who experience the richness of the music.

Several friends noticed my pause and concentration on the final benediction at worship on Thursday. I did reflect on the privilege and the power of being able to speak God's blessing on God's people gathered as the Northwest Washington Synod. I may have been the one speaking the words, but the benediction that night was a blessing to me that I will treasure.

One of the joys and comforts of this office has been the knowledge that you, as individuals and as congregations pray for your bishops each week. Being in congregations and hearing that we are praying for our bishops, Mark and Chris, continues to be a source of strength and comfort as the work presents itself. I ask you to include bishop-elect Kirby in that petition and on August 1st to pray regularly for Bishop Unti and all that he will face in the coming years.

The July Synod Council meeting will be my last one after 20 years. I served two terms as a member of the council and two terms as bishop. It has been a privilege to serve Christ's church in this way.

You are in my prayers in the days ahead. In that prayer I will continue to give thanks for you knowing that the good work begun among you will be brought to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. Thanks be to God.

Kirby Unti Elected Bishop of ELCA, Northwest Washington Synod

The Rev. B. Kirby Unti was elected on May 19 to a six-year term as bishop of the Northwest Washington Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) at the 2013 Synod Assembly held in Lynnwood. Unti, 61, is the Pastor of St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in Renton, Washington. The incumbent bishop, the Rev. Wm. Chris Boerger, elected in 2001 and re-elected in 2007, was term limited. Unti, who led on all ballots, was elected on the fourth ballot for bishop, 230-151 over the Rev. Jeffrey Russell, Central Lutheran Church, Everett. There were 15 nominees on the first ballot. Unti will assume the bishop's office on August 1. The installation date has been set for September 15. The Rev. Mark Hanson, Presiding Bishop of the ELCA, will install bishop-elect Unti. Unti was born in Spokane, Washington. He earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Washington in 1974. He earned a master of divinity from Pacific Theological Seminary. He was ordained in May 1978. Unti served as the Assistant Pastor at Faith Lutheran Church in Bellingham. In 1980, Unti became Pastor at St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in Renton. Unti and his wife, Kim, are parents to four grown children.
