New Beginnings and Fresh Starts: It's a New World Every Morning by Pastor Larry Thomas

"*The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.*" (Lamentations 3:22)

"What does baptism mean for daily living? It means that our sinful self, with all its evil deeds and desires, should be drowned through daily repentance; and that day after day a new self should arise to live with God in righteousness and purity forever." (The Sacrament of Holy Baptism, Martin Luther, The Small Catechism)

"*Abba Poeman said regarding Abba Prior that every day he made a new beginning.*" (The Sayings of the Desert Fathers)

"It's a new world every morning." I love that line. I read it in a book set on a ranch in Eastern Oregon. Those words of wisdom were spoken by an old cowboy to a young man. For years I wrote those words on the cover of my journals and at the top of my daily to do lists. "It's a new world every morning" are words of gospel promise and renewal.

Those words remind me of other timeless truths: the author of *Lamentations* lamenting the devastation and destruction of Jerusalem and the deportation of all of

her residents to Babylon in the 6th Century B.C. manages by God's grace to find light in the darkness: "God's mercies are new every morning." Martin Luther, explaining the daily gift of baptism and inviting believers to daily repentance and to day by day claim our new life promise in Christ to a new-self daily resurrection. One church father reporting on the spiritual practice of his brother in Christ who made a new beginning every day. All of these insights express the daily promise of "It's a new world every morning."

I love the promise of new beginnings and fresh starts. My challenge is being mindful and attentive to all the possibilities for starting over and beginning again that are presented to me each day and in every moment. A new day is as rich with promise as a new year. Like the clean slate calendar of a new year, each and every day is wide open to fresh starts and new beginnings, new experiences and new learnings.

I know. That sounds like a pretty tall order. Living life attentively, intentionally, attuned to and aware of what's going on around us and inside us moment by moment and day by day is not our natural default. And, it's getting harder and harder which means it's more and more important. Mindful of the possibility and promise of each new moment and each new day, is a grace and gift that is there for the asking. So, ask, seek, and knock, and the door will be opened to you. Each and every moment; each and every day; is a grace-filled opportunity for a fresh start and a new beginning. It's a new world every morning! "*Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, O Lord, so that we may rejoice and be glad all our days.*" (Psalm 90:14)

Mudhouse Sabbath - Begins September 29

Mudhouse Sabbath is book by Lauren F. Winner that explores eleven spiritual practices inspired by Judaism and the life of Jesus. Following her conversion from Orthodox Judaism to Christianity, Lauren Winner found that her life was indelibly marked by the rich traditions and spiritual practices of Judaism. She set out to discover how she could incorporate some of these practices into her new faith.

In her book, *Mudhouse Sabbath*, Dr. Winner, who teaches at Duke Divinity School, presents eleven Jewish spiritual practices that can transform the way Christians view the world, and God. 

OSLC's Social Concerns Committee

It's Fall! Time to renew and get involved!

Did you know that OSLC's Social Concerns teams are actively involved in supporting multiple community services organizations? Through our annual budget funds and individual contributions we support the following:

Eastside Baby Corner. We selected a Summer Fun theme for this drive. Donations included summer activities needs such as sunscreen & bug spray, Little Swimmers, sun glasses and beach toys. Items were delivered in early July.

Issaquah Food and Clothing Bank. This organization provides several avenues of community services, and OSLC has been supporting them for years. In addition to the food, clothing and household items we have gathered and donated, OSLC has assisted with the recent Tools 4Schools backpack supply drive. OSLC donated 46 backpacks to IFCB. IFCB has served over 400 families a week this summer. Many in our congregation volunteer by providing food clothing and personal time. If you are interested, please contact the social concerns team.

This fall we will adopt an Issaquah school to provide breakfast bars to be given to students who are in need of a breakfast during school hours. Our IFCB contact will send a list of needy schools to adopt. Once we select the school, they will contact our social concerns liaison and let us know how many cases of bars they will need on a monthly basis. Social concerns will then purchase and deliver the bars to the school.

The off shoot **Nourishing Network** is a multi- organizational group who meet monthly to establish additional community services such as the Fruit Tree Gleaning program, where locally grown produce and fruit available in Issaquah is put to good use. The fruit is gathered and distributed to families at the local food bank center. Community and private gardens donate food as well. Nourishing Network also brings people and projects together, such as providing lunches to Tiger Mountain High School. Contact Judi Case or Connie Fletcher for more information.

Issaquah Meals Program This organization coordinates local churches and other organizations as they provide a hot meal on weeknights. Additional meals on weekends are often provided by other local benefactors. We typically deliver meals on the second Tuesday of every month. It only takes three volunteers to prepare and deliver a meal at the Issaquah fire station's community room. Attendance varies by season, but is usually around 36 – 40 people. Our population consists of teens, families with small children, adults (both employed and unemployed) and many marginalized individuals who need a sense of community and a good meal to stretch their budgets. Please consider volunteering! Contact Judi Case for more information.

Compassion House This organization offers families a home and social services as they rebuild lives and recover from major life challenges. Donations have been made from social concerns funds to furnish household items and other necessities.

Our annual **Thanksgiving food basket reverse donation** will take place in November. We will solicit food items and grocery store gift cards/cash donations. Our **Christmas ornament gift selection** will also take place in early December. Watch for more updates as we approach these seasons.



Lutherwood is a camp for kids to enjoy away from home while trying new things with friends and celebrating being Lutheran. There are many types of programs at the camp to participate in.

Just a few weeks ago, I was at Lutherwood in Bellingham. That time I chose to one of the camp's unique programs, OAP (Outdoor Adventure Program). The part of the program I did was high adventure, which is very new at Lutherwood. Like all the other choices for camp we had to stay in a group with a counselor for a week singing songs, playing games, and enjoying being with others. The special thing I liked about high adventure is the rock climbing.

The counselors teach you how to tie safe knots for good climbing. They use the experience not just for a rock wall but for a real cliff. Another part of high adventure, I think is wonderful, is the backpacking and camping. Staying out in a tent one night with the group was a special moment. I would recommend having hiking and camping gear for this camp.

Three weeks later I went to Lutherwood again. I did a different OAP program, the H20 camp. It was the same as the other camps with the counselors and events. This camp was fantastic as well. Our group went on the water wake boarding and knee boarding about four to five hours every day. I started this camp with no skill at all in water sports and ended up being able to stand up on the board and enjoy the ride. This camp is good for many ages since your ability at the beginning will always improve at the end. I would really support, when going to H20 camp, to bring at least two towels since you are on the water so often. Lutherwood has a boatshed with all the useful tools for a fun and professional ride.

Those are just two of the camps I went to this year. Lutherwood offers many more. Each camp is special in their own way. When your kids go to Lutherwood, find the right camp for them. They can always come back next year for a chance to try another program.
