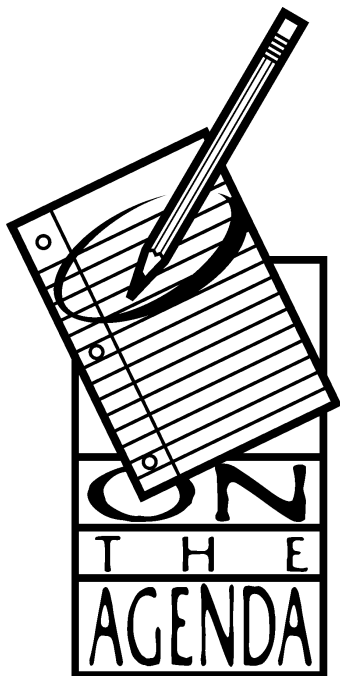
Pacific Standard Time Begins November 3, 2013

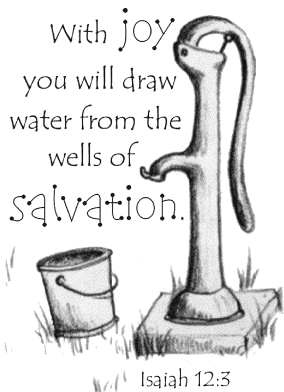

Thursday Morning Bible Study

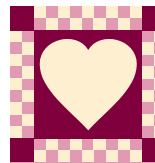
2 Samuel
