January 1: Name of Jesus and New Year's Day

Eight days after the birth of Jesus, eight days after the shepherds visited Mary, Joseph and the infant Jesus in Bethlehem, after eight days had passed, it was time to circumcise the child. St. Luke puts it this way in his gospel: "After eight days had passed it was time to circumcise the child, and he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb."

When January 1 falls on a Sunday, the church calendar offers up "Name of Jesus," as the theme of the day, not "New Year's Day." It's not that the church has any problem with New Year's Day; it's just that "The Name of Jesus" trumps our football game laden Rose Parade day after New Year's Eve celebrations of a new year.

Why? Because the name of Jesus is the name that saves. The name of Jesus saves us from our sins; the name of Jesus saves us for new life. In the Christmas gospel reading from John, chapter one, John promises that all who receive Jesus, who believe in his name, are given power to become the children of God.

The name of Jesus charms our fears And bids our sorrows cease Sings music in the sinner's ears Brings life and health and peace.

Fears charmed and sorrows ceasing are music in this sinner's ears. The grace and gift of life and health and peace? That sounds to me like a pretty good way to begin a new year and a new day. Looking back on 2013 and looking ahead to 2014, my hope and prayer is that God will take our hearts and "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me." That God will "restore to me the joy of God's salvation and sustain in me a willing spirit." (Psalm 51:10-12) Name of Jesus, New Year's Day, call January 1 anything you want. The gospel truth of the matter is it's a new day, a new year, and God's time for new beginnings and fresh starts.

The Didache: The Faith and Practice of the Earliest Christians
January 5, 12, 19, 26 and February 16 @ 9:45 a.m.

How did the first Christians practice their faith? The Didache, an early handbook of an anonymous Christian community (it is believed to have been written between 50 and 130 A.D.) may be the most important book you've never heard of. Also known as "The Teaching of the Twelve," the Didache spells out a way of life for disciples of Jesus including instruction on baptism, holy communion, prayer, hospitality, generosity, and how to love one another. The Didache is one of the oldest Christian texts not found in the New Testament. Each class session will begin with a brief video introduction by Tony Jones. Copies of the book, The Teaching of the Twelve: Believing and Practicing the Primitive Christianity of the Ancient *Didache Community,* are available in the church office for \$10 each.




Winter on the Website
