Building the Kingdom from a Park Bench

[Jesus] came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God.

Ephesians 2:17-19

Pause for a moment and imagine an ordinary scene from an Issaquah neighborhood. It is cold and clear outside. The distant sun sends flirtatious rays that warm your face and lift your spirits. The frost on the grass before you glints in the sunshine, and children's voices from the nearby playground infuse the air with energy. You choose a comfortable bench that faces the pleasant southern sunlight while still affording a view of the clear foothills and mountains in the distance.

Perhaps you feel moved to give thanks for the simple and persistent beauty that God lavishes upon us each new day. This choice we make to slow ourselves and

remember the obvious blessings all around can center us and change how we feel. Be encouraged. It is good to pause and give thanks. And from our thankful reveries, God is calling us to open up our senses and actively listen to these neighborhoods we live in. Through the clear strong Word of Jesus, God is revealing that some are near and others are far off and that we are the ones called to bring them together.

Back to our imaginary Issaquah park bench, look ahead and there is a basketball court full of teenagers. They gather to play and work on their skills, and in Christ, we know that even more than this they are looking and longing for friendship, for a place to belong. Look left and there is a retired couple probably in their late sixties out walking their small dog. They walk to get some exercise and stay active, and in Christ, we know that they, too, are looking and longing for friendship, for a place to belong. Look right and the same can be said of the moms and dads hovering over strollers with a watchful eye on their toddlers scaling the play structure.

At OSLC, we lift up and engage this calling to build community each and every week. We proclaim the household of God. We invite and gather around the Lord's supper table. We baptize into the family of God where all are unique and beloved children. Within our little family of faith and outside of our walls, God is bringing together those who are far off and those who are near. God is breaking down walls and declaring that "you are no longer strangers and aliens."

Barnes & Noble Bookstore, Issaquah *Monday, March 10 @ 7:30 p.m.*



Social Concerns Committee Update

This was a very busy December! Thanks to Dianne Tanner, Georgeanne Park, Jan Setterlund, Margot Inman and a host of others for taking leadership roles in providing Christmas gifts for those in need. A total of 45 adults and 28 children were provided with gift cards through OSLC. Nineteen of the 30 families were members of OLSC, or their extended families. A total of \$2,135 was donated through our church, with about \$200 remaining in gift cards to be used for other emergencies throughout the year. Gift cards were augmented with toys, hats and clothing donated through our members and the Mariner's Wives toy drive, with which Dianne Tanner is affiliated.

Social Concerns is active year-round. Here is how you can help:

OSLC provides a community meal for approximately 40 low income and homeless people the second Tuesday of each month at the Community Hall next to the Fire Station. Social Concerns is looking for ministry teams, or groups of friends or family members in our church to take on one of the twelve meals we are responsible for.

A hot breakfast program has been started at Tiger Mountain Community High School (TMCH) on late start Wednesdays. Community groups, like OSLC, are being asked to provide food, and/or cook the hot breakfast once a month for these students. The Issaquah School District does not provide breakfast for its students and many of the TMCH students are low income and even homeless. These breakfasts provide not only nourishment, but an opportunity to build community. OSLC Social Concerns is considering taking on one of the weekly Wednesday breakfasts. Can you help with this?

TENT CITY 4 NEWS: This program that serves the homeless, many of whom are working poor, vacated Mary Queen of Peace in Sammamish on January 17th following a three-month stay. This was due to the limitations imposed by the Sammamish city permit which has a maximum of 90 days for this type of encampment. Arrangements for the next site have fallen through. Members of the Faith Community on the Eastside are being asked to come together to find a solution. If you would like to work on a short term or long term solution for homelessness, please let us know.
