# What's Your Buzz Word?

What's your buzz word? Relevancy, branding, market share, wheelhouse, secret sauce, growth values, thought leader...I hear these business buzz words daily, and even use most of them in my business encounters. I have been asked "Are you a strong contributor?" "What have you done to become more relevant today?" Always in the context of what I can contribute to the larger organization.

I have been questioning these things of myself recently, as my professional career path is changing course and I encounter new challenges and expectations. As I attempt to sort them all out, I am forced to face the reality: I believe I am relevant, but I am not really sure, and no, I don't know if these words apply to me.

The buzz words we encounter in our professional lives are typically not terms we think of in the context of our spiritual and congregational lives for sure, but when one begins to question core concepts and beliefs, how can you keep the spiritual from the professional? I found that I can't. So here are some thought provoking questions I came up with:

Are you relevant - as a Christian living Christ's word; are you contributing to your daily congregational life, growing disciples, sharing the good word in the larger community we live in, increasing our Lutheran market share?

Do you understand the Lutheran brand? Can you give that two minute elevator speech on what it means to be Lutheran in today's community? Or at Our Savior?

Where do you fit in the organizational chart of Jesus' Christly Business? Are you exhibiting

the necessary spiritual growth values of clear thinking, inclusiveness and courage, supporting other members when there is a need? Are these traits in your everyday Christian wheelhouse?

What I came to realize is this: if you answer 'I am not sure' or 'I don't have all the answers', it's okay. If you can't check all the boxes next to the buzz words, not to worry. We are all employed by Christ and our individual contributions and the paths we tread are always relevant. We have the unique blessing of on the job training. We can all be strong contributors in a variety of ways.

While we should always be building our internal Christian resume, adding accomplishments, new skills and competencies is really what our Christian life is all about. We can and should be looking at ways to add new context and work on God's team. Our relevancy must always be considered, and new ways to contribute should be sought. In I Corinthians 12 Paul writes: "There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. <sup>5</sup> There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. <sup>6</sup> There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work."

So the next time you are asked – 'are you relevant', or 'what is your buzz word', take a minute to reflect on your Christian life and talents, and then speak your own buzz words with Christ's blessing.



What's So Amazing About Grace? March 2nd @ 6:30—8:30 p.m.


