


Summer Sunday Morning Worship Services @ 9:30 a.m.



After years of growth and robust ringing, the Memorial Bells finds itself at a crossroads: with current ringer participation at an all-time low, can membership be revived so that the Bells' music ministry may continue, or will the group cease its regular participation in the worship life of OSLC?

The very name of the choir recalls part of its history through gifts given in loving memory of family members. Including contributions from the Bergsma (the original three octaves in 1980), Fricke and Lewis households and others, the Memorial Bells grew from three to six octaves, including chimes. At local and national events, our bell choir stands alone.

But fewer ringers mean many of the bells currently remain silent. After years of service, members move on, even as a dedicated core remains. New members are needed.

To accommodate busy schedules, and to encourage members of our community to explore handbell ringing, we are trying something new this fall: a shortened time commitment (rehearsals will begin in mid-October), with limited rehearsals and fewer performance dates. Bell ringing is easily accessible, with mastery developed over time.

Over these summer months, consider how you might support the revitalization of the Memorial Bells. Do you know someone who might find the limited time commitment of interest (this could be a wonderful way to introduce someone to our congregation)? Is this something you might be curious to try? Please feel free to contact me with any questions you may have.

It is our hope to ultimately grow back into our full six octaves. In this way, we can honor the vision behind the naming of our congregation's bell choir: that the living sound of ringing bells celebrates our faith family as it praises our God.

start up again. Since yarn is still available, new shawls may be added to the inventory. Contact the church office if you have questions or desire some yarn to start creating a prayer shaw!


