President's Update: Transitional Change

CHURCH Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. Isaiah 43:18-19

These are hard words to hear unless you have faith. Faith that when we are faced with uncertainty, and reach for the familiar and find it missing, we will still be okay. Faith in our Lord that he will guide us in uncertain times and show us new beginnings. We are beginning a time of transition, a time of change for sure. What will our future look like? How will we know what our congregation will need or want?

Interim Pastor Dick Christensen will lead us though these times, and guide the transition team as they seek understanding, gather input on our future needs, and complete the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). We are in the final stage of confirming our transition team, and once we have the team complete, I will be announcing them to our congregation. They will begin the tasks of completing the MSP under the guidance of Pastor Christensen. This team will report to the Council on a regular basis, and will need the support of all of us. Their work is not light, and they will bear the burden of gathering information, opinions and insights as they complete the MSP. This process will be lengthy. Their work needs prayer, and each of the members of this team will need prayer partners to lift them up as they gather the required information in the MSP. This living document contains multiple sections that are designed to help us define who we are, and what we see as our future direction. We will record member demographics such as age distribution, describe characteristics of our congregation such as socio-economics, recent trends, strategic goals and partnerships with our community and the ELCA. We will revisit our vision and mission statements, look at our inherent giftedness, and define what we seek in terms of new leadership and ministry. This process is intended to make us dig deep, and really think about our future needs.

The MSP will in essence become the roadmap, our 'way in the wilderness.' The results of the MSP will be sent to the Synod Office, and Bishop Unti will use this information as he selects candidates for our new lead pastor. Our Call Committee will also receive a copy of this report, to help them in their prayerful considerations of candidates. As we face change, there are many strongholds here for us to take comfort in – Associate Pastor Fletcher is fully engaged in our daily Christian life at OSLC, teaching the youth and teaching confirmation, visiting the sick, and counseling those in need. Interim Pastor Christensen has already begun Bible studies, ministers to those in need, and brings a wealth of experience in transition planning. Our staff works diligently to plan worship, take care of the needs of the building, scheduling lectors and communion assistants, and in general making themselves available to the needs of all of us as we come and go in ministry and mission. We are truly blessed to have these loving people to help us all as we turn towards 'a new thing'.

During this time, we all need to lift each of our brothers and sisters up – to be understanding of needs, slow to judge, and remember that behind anger often lies grief. Let each of us when called upon be a good ear, a comforting shoulder. Some routines have and will continue to change – let us be willing to offer help, to fill voids and bring resolutions, step in and volunteer, and in general engage with all the needs of our Christian community here at OSLC.

In the next few months, many will be asked to share ideas, information and hope for a new future at OSLC. I encourage you all to respond with your hearts, and focus on our future together as disciples in Christ. I also ask that you continue to reach out to me with concerns, ideas and other issues that you feel need to be expressed. Our Council remains available to hear your needs as well.

I have said this to you, so that in me you may have peace. In the world you face persecution. But take courage; I have conquered the world. John 16:33


We have completed four months of the 2014/15 fiscal year.
