

Our ultimate goal is to prepare a Ministry Site Proposal (MSP) for the synod which will provide detailed information about:

- ★ the demographics of our church family and the demographics of the geographical area surrounding our church,
- → our vision for OSLC in the future
- → our priorities regarding our ministry(ies)
- ♦ what kind of church we are and want to be
- ★ the qualities and abilities necessary in our future pastor, etc.

In order to complete the MSP, a great deal of information must be collected from records, histories and – most importantly – from *YOU*, the members of OSLC.

We have divided our tasks into four categories under each of which is a long list of tactics and tasks:

- **→** Getting organized (defining the procedures, timelines, tactics and tasks)
- ★ Keeping the congregation informed (developing a communication plan)
- → Facilitating the involvement of all congregants, and
- **→** Completing and submitting a useful MSP to the Bishop and OSLC call committee.

In the near future, we will be developing tools with which to elicit your visions and opinions. Until the formal mechanisms exist, however, the Team encourages you to e-mail your ideas and thoughts to the committee at transitionteam@oslcissaquah.org. We will read, consider, and save all of them and incorporate them into the completed MSP.

The Bishop's office will sort through the resumes of potential candidates and send those that best match the needs and desires of our church (now and looking toward the future) to the call committee. The call committee will review these and interview the most promising candidates and, ultimately, make a selection.

We welcome your questions and/or comments and will keep you regularly informed as the work progresses. God bless you all, God bless OSLC, and may He give us wisdom in the months ahead.



Chiclayo, Peru Scholarship Fund @ OSLC

The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Chiclayo (IELCH), in Chiclayo, Peru, consists of the three congregations of San Antonio, Las Brisas, and Las Lomas. OSLC has had an ongoing relationship with IELCH since our first youth mission trip in 2001. With our most recent youth mission trip in July 2014, these bonds are stronger than ever.

During our recent mission trip, Henrik Christopherson identified three young women in need of financial support for post-secondary education. These three young women – Miriam Gomez of San Antonio, Suzie Llantop of Las Lomas, and Priscilla Tirado Bensus of Las Brisas – are active in their congregations, and have interacted with OSLC mission trips since they were young girls in 2001.







Miriam, Suzie, and Priscilla are pictured from left to right above. Miriam is the daughter of Pastor Merci of San Antonio. She would like to earn a degree in Psychology. Suzie is the daughter of Pastor Harold of Las Lomas. She is halfway through a course in Accounting. Priscilla is the daughter of Rebecca Bensus, a pivotal figure in the Last Brisas congregation. Priscilla is as yet undecided on her area of study. All three of these young women were actively involved in our recent mission trip.

Beginning in January 2015, OSLC has set up a Peru Scholarship Fund to sponsor each of these young women with a \$70 per month educational scholarship. This is the going rate for university studies in Chiclayo. For each student, this scholarship would be renewable in 2016 and 2017, if they continue in their studies. This represents a grand total of \$7560 over three years. We are very excited about getting this scholarship program going. It will serve to further strengthen the bonds between OSLC and IELCH, and it will give hope and opportunity to three deserving young women – and perhaps to other deserving students in the future!

It's 2015, What's Next for the ELCA Malaria Campaign?

From the beginning, the ELCA Malaria Campaign has had a goal to raise \$15 million by 2015. The Campaign has now received \$13.3 million from generous Lutherans! **Thank you!** This means that we are 88% of the way towards our goal of \$15 million. Now is the time to finish strong and assure that we meet that goal, but what is next? We know that malaria, while reduced, will not be eliminated. Moving forward we will continue to work with companions in Africa to reduce deaths from malaria. While the focused fundraising campaign will conclude, the work supported by the ELCA Malaria Campaign will continue through he health care programs supported through ELCA World Hunger. The official campaign will end this year, but our commitment to saving lives from malaria will continue! [Note: the ELCA's fiscal year goes through the month of January, so the official end date of the ELCA Malaria Campaign will be January 31, 2016.]

Opportunities for Mission

Rev. Peter Shen will return to China in March to continue his work as an ELCA consultant on relations with churches in China. During this visit, Rev. Shen will be accompanied the Presiding Bishop of the ELCA, Rev. Elizabeth Eaton, as she learns about the work of the Christian church in China.

March 22nd - Henrik and Patty Christopherson, missionaries in Peru, will be at OSLC. Some of our youth and adults spent time with the Christophersons while on their recent mission trip to Peru. Through generous gifts to the World Mission Prayer League (WMPL), OSLC have supported the Christophersons' mission work.

September 16 through October 6 - John and Elaine Stamm will be returning to Tanzania and you are invited to join them!

Travel with a Purpose

You are invited to join a "hands-on" mission trip to Tanzania, East Africa, where you will observe and participate in the challenging educational work of the SAFI School Project (SSP). For the past eight years, the SSP has provided a variety of essential resources to improve Ngateu Lutheran Secondary School in Arusha, Tanzania. Ngateu serves extremely poor students, mostly of the Maasai tribe.

John and Elaine Stamm will lead this journey, September 16th -October 6th. Participants will meet students and help them improve their English language skills. Participants will also meet with the teachers, administrators and staff to learn about their challenges and life stories.

Included will be visits to ELCA Global Mission programs such as the Arusha Lutheran Medical Center, the Lutheran Center for Children and an agricultural demonstration project that teaches sustainable farming practices. You will also visit the MaaSAE Girls Lutheran Secondary School in Monduli and go on safari trips to Tarangire National Park, Ngorongoro National Park and the Serengeti Plain. The African Cultural Arts Center in Arusha is also a highlight.

Lotus Nayru Azofiefa Stamm

Baptized, in Nosara, Costa Rica

In 1919 my Great, Great Grandmother, Ina Davis Bostelman crocheted the yoke, cuffs and edging for the baptism dress she made for my Great Grandmother, Caroline in a small community in Ohio. It was custom in 1919 to have baptism dresses very, very long, so when Caroline Bostelman Wesche had her daughter Elaine, my Grandma Stamm, baptized in this dress (1942), she shortened it by sewing 10 rows of tucks in it. Elaine Wesche Stamm's daughter, Cherie (my mom) was baptized (1974) in this dress because my Great Aunt Debbie Wesche brought it from Ohio to Eugene, Oregon while my mom was traveling from Seoul, South Korea to be adopted by my Grandma and Grandpa Stamm. My mom, Cherie Stamm-Azofiefa asked my Grandma Stamm to bring this dress from Ohio to Nosara , Costa Rica so I could be baptized in it. Grandma will return it to Ohio, so that all my cousins can continue to wear it too.

A Word About Twelve Step Groups

Twelve Step meetings are commonly found in churches even though they are completely autonomous and not directly affiliated with any outside organization. OSLC houses a total of three Twelve Step groups: Alcoholics Anonymous, Overeaters Anonymous and Al-Anon which meet on a weekly basis within the building. Each group is self-supporting and contributes a donation to the church for the use of its facilities.

The message of all Twelve Step groups is similar to the one we try to practice in the church, namely to deal with our self-centeredness. The Big Book of AA states, "Selfishness, self-centeredness. . . that we think is the root of our troubles.. . Above everything, we must be rid of our selfishness. First of all, we had to quit playing God. It didn't work. Next, we decided that hereafter in this drama of life, God was going to be our Director. When we sincerely took such a position, all sorts of remarkable things followed. As we felt new power flow in. . . we discovered we could fact life successfully. We were reborn." (pgs. 62, 63 of AA). Is this not the message we try to declare in our church? It is appropriate that the church open its doors to Twelve Step groups and be thankful for the chance to join hands in the common task of "carrying the message to those who suffer."

Anyone is welcome to attend an open meeting of any Twelve Step group. You don't need to be a card carrying member to benefit from the practice of the twelve steps. For more information, you are invited to talk with the Pastor.
