Dear Sisters and Brothers:

The Word is out and about. "Christ is risen. Christ is risen, indeed."

In Word and Sacrament we celebrate that truth. In the songs that are sung we affirm what God has made known to us. In prayer we ask God to enliven and lead us. In deeds of mercy we enshrine the reality that "Christ is risen. Christ is risen, indeed." Surrounded by the blessing of Easter we move into the next months of life in the Parish.

Elected leaders are working hard to discover and shape a vision for this people. You will have the opportunity to be in conversation about the vision. Regular work continues with changes that are part of any transition in Parish or individual lives. The living Jesus is among us to nurture and goad us into what we are to become.

As an Easter people there are things to remember as we live together. Think and pray about our life together.

Patience remains a virtue. Moving too fast usually results in outcomes no one wants. Careful consideration takes time. But, the investment is worth it.

Details of Parish life are important. But, don't make them more important than they are. Losing track of the forest for the trees gets in the road of our work together. Remember that this time is a gift to us so we can discover how God wants this Parish "forest" to grow and develop. Old growth must be partnered with new growth or the "forest" will not survive.

Give up on hurtful moments in the past. Jesus was not raised from the dead in order to get even with those who hurt or disappointed him. Jesus was raised to close off the past and open up the future. Jesus is our teacher. Let go of the ugly. Embrace the beautiful that God has waiting for us all.

Don't create new hurtful moments for others. Allow Jesus to shape your heart. Allow your heart to control your brain. Make sure both heart and brain are in gear before saying things that are un-true, unnecessary, and un-loving.

Take time to discover the ministries of the Parish and God's whole Church. Leaders in the Parish are working hard to keep you informed. We are alive and well. The ELCA is alive and well. The Church catholic is alive and well. Learn about our health and wholeness. Pray that it will increase. Give thanks to God for God's continuing work of using God's people to shape the new creation that God set in motion at Easter.

Encourage grownups to act like grownups. Even the most spoiled child doesn't get to stay home from school because the child doesn't like the teacher, the lessons, or the classmates. Folks sometimes abandon a Parish because they don't like everything that is happening.

Remember that no Parish is ever going to mirror everyone's tastes and needs with flawless exactitude. We need to learn how to live in community where the accent is on "us" and not on "me."

Live in the new creation and be the new creatures God has made possible in the miracle and mystery of Jesus' death and resurrection. Don't waste Easter and its power for transformation.

A crucial part of my work of Pastoral care is to pray for you. The notions above will be shaping my prayers for you as the Season of Easter begins.

Maundy Thursday Service of Holy Communion

April 2nd at 12:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.

With nightfall, our Lenten observance comes to an end, and we gather with Christians around the world to celebrate the Three days of Jesus' death and resurrection. At the heart of the Maundy Thursday liturgy is Jesus' commandment to love one another. As Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, we are called to follow his example as we care for one another and for the poor and the unloved. At the Lord's table we remember Jesus' sacrifice of his life, even as we are called to offer ourselves in love for the life of the world.

Good Friday Worship Service

April 3rd at 12:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.

The ancient title for this day—the triumph of the cross—reminds us that the church gathers not to mourn but to celebrate Christ's life-giving passion and to find strength and hope in the tree of life. This year's Good Friday will include liturgies, stations of the cross and prayers around the cross.

Resurrection of our Lord—Easter Day Worship

April 5th at 8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.

Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! On the first day of the week God transformed the creation and darkness into light. On this, the "eighth day" of the week, Jesus Christ was raised from the dead. We celebrate this new creation in the waters of baptism and in the feast of victory. With great joy we celebrate this day of days, even as we begin the great fifty days of Easter. Filled with hope, we go forth to share the news that Christ is risen! Easter brunch will be served following the 8:00 and 9:30 a.m. worship services. Coffee will be served as usual following the 11:00 a.m. worship service.

THE TRANSITION TEAM TO DATE - MARCH 2015

REPORT TO OSLC COUNCIL AND CONGREGATION

The Transition Team has been meeting every week including, when necessary, longer, open-ended, off-site meetings to tackle large, complex projects. In addition, we work together almost daily via e-mail to develop and share information. We have elected Randy Baseler as the Chairperson, Brook Buchanan as Vice Chair, and Marilyn Carlson as Secretary. What we have accomplished to date is as follows:

Introduction and **Installation of the Transition** Team before the congregation.

Development of a "**Roadmap**" (see next page) to guide the work stream of the team. The tasks listed under the four sections each have – or will have – a Detail Page to break down the steps involved in the task.

We have facilitated the Team's work in progress by creating:

- a Transition Team Group E-mail (TransitionTeam@oslcissaquah.org), and
- a cloud-based file sharing resource, "**Dropbox**," which we have organized into folders for easy location of work files.

Creation of a new and separate **Bulletin Board** to make visible to parishioners plans for the work of transition, tasks accomplished and those in progress. The Bulletin Board will display the "Roadmap," "Holy History," Monthly Reports, a sample copy of the MSP which the Transition Team is working to complete, and an invitation to congregants' to submit their comments in a suggestion box or by e-mail to the Transition Team.

Gathered material to create a "Holy History" display, a pictorial record of OSLC's history comprising photos, slideshows, documents, etc. to remind parishioners of what we were, what we have come through, and what we are today. We are working on methods by which we can show all the photos and documents while preserving the originals.

Collection of information from OSLC records, other congregations who have gone through a similar process, the ELCA and synod, and other sources.

Obtaining an accessible **MSP form** on which we can track our progress on line.

Demographic work on both OSLC, as well as all the zip codes we serve in the surrounding community, such as:

- Analysis of current membership (age, gender, ethnicity, and distance from OSLC)
- Growth projections
- Number of retirees, families, other groups entering the community
- Strength of referral network for new members in the community

Discussed various means of Communicating to the Congregation, including

Monthly Report to: Council and the Focus; an insert in the Worship Bulletin; a Sunday Listening Post, a
Comment Box, Temple Talks, and the new Bulletin Board. Decisions and action to come on developing
those which are most promising.

The Transition Team is making good progress on developing **Survey Vehicles** to gather congregation input. Questions on the completed survey will correlate with information required by the ELCA and Synod, with the addition of information that is specifically critical to OSLC. To ensure access by all members of OSLC, the survey(s) will be distributed, when completed, both by paper mail and e-mail, with an option to complete on line.






OSLC's Book Club
