Dear Sisters and Brothers:

"Summertime and the living is easy." And aren't you glad.

The Parish time together over the next three months will be easier. But, relaxed is not the same thing as comatose. Life goes on.

Each Sunday the Parish gathers at 9:30 a.m. for worship. The Holy Communion with Chalice and Individual Glasses will be done from May 24 through July 5. The Holy Communion with intinction will be done from July 12 through September 6.

Work will be done in the building in anticipation of the fall schedule. Help will be needed with painting, moving, furniture selection, and all the stuff of adjusting building use.

An outdoor work party happened on May 30. The grounds need attention after God does God's work of renewing the creating with rain, sun, and growth.

The Transition Team to Date - May 2015

Report to OSLC Council and Congregation

The Transition Team has continued meeting every week (except Easter week), through multiple daily e-mails, and at longer, open-ended work sessions (one of which lasted 7 hours!) What we have accomplished this month is as follows:

<u>Survey #1</u>: Our work these past weeks has been focused on completing the first survey, to determine parishioners' perception of OSLC as it is today, and as they would like it to become.

Mark and Marilyn located and downloaded surveys from other churches who submitted MSPs to the Bishop's office, and these provided interesting information.

After several revisions, we sought the input of beta testers (family members), incorporated their comments, and finalized the questions and format.

We then scripted a cover note and announcements that were made in numerous worship services, and we worked with Janet to provide an on-line survey link and distribute the survey to parishioners, both electronically and on paper. Team members manually converted all paper submissions to the Google format so that everyone's comments would be compiled in the final results. We encouraged people to take the survey and even helped some of them input their comments.

We then reviewed and tabulated the data and developed a Power-Point presentation that was shown at the Open Forum on May 3.

<u>Survey #2</u>: We are now developing the second survey, starting with an open-ended session on May 8. Prior to this, we've been discussing leadership qualities to seek in a new pastor, whether or not to address various staffing options in the next survey (based on the input re: priorities from the first survey) and options for worship service scheduling (one service or two?)

Some parishioners provided interesting ideas that we will incorporate into the results for Survey #2.

The **<u>Bulletin Board</u>** serves as a continual updating of the Transition Team progress via posting of Reports to Council, Weekly Meeting Summaries, etc., in addition to the Comments Box, electronic photos, and church history documents.

That's it for now... still working!

If a problem is brought before the Mutual Ministry Committee, committee members will actively listen, interpret, pray and, as necessary, advise in a compassionate and supportive fashion.

Pastor Larry used to say the Mutual Ministry Committee is like the Maytag repairman. We're okay when we don't have any agenda items, but we're here to serve should issues arise.

Global Missions: God's Work. Our Hands. *Tanzania Post-Secondary Education Support*

Ngateu Lutheran Secondary School, Arusha, Tanzania, is the poorest of the nine secondary schools of the North Central Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania. Students attending Ngateu come from poverty stricken families of subsistence farmers whose

average disposable income is \$200 per year.

While a few top graduates of Ngateu might qualify for limited government financial support, most students qualifying for post-secondary school vocational education and training they need to be productive citizens come from poverty stricken families.

In order to break the cycle of poverty and help make deserving young women and men productive citizens, we seek to raise \$1,000 to support the post-secondary education program initiated by the Safi School Project. The Safi School Project, a 501(c)3 non-profit, based in Lacey, Washington, provides financial resource for Ngateu graduates who do not qualify for government supported post-secondary vocational education.

Five OSLC members (Connie Fletcher, Les and Kate Gagnon, John and Elaine Stamm) will be at Ngateu Secondary School in September and October and will hand-deliver our contributions for deserving students.

Can We Editor's Note: Below are two reports from OSLC Synod Assembly delegates Lisa Thomassen and Maury Clark. They, along with Pr. Christensen, attended the Northwest Washington Synod Assembly which was held May 15-16, 2015. More information from the Assembly can be found at www.lutheransnw.org.

> The 2015 Assembly of the Northwest Washington Synod was held May 15-16, 2015 in Everett, Washington. Bishop Kirby Unti presided over the assembly with the theme "Can We Talk?"

Report from Lisa Thomassen:

I attended the Northwest Washington Synod Assembly May 15-16 themed "Can We Talk", with a focus on open communication.

The speakers included Dr. Cynthia Moe-Lobeda, speaking on "Why do we not talk with freedom?" Christina Jackson-Skelton, Executive Director of the Mission Advancement unit of the ELCA, and the keynote speaker Rev. Mark Lau Branson, who is a Professor at Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, CA and teaches congregational leadership and community engagement. In small groups, he guided us through the process of appreciative inquiry with a set of questions. "Appreciative inquiry is the cooperative search for the best in people, their organizations, and the world around them. It involves systematic discovery of what gives a system 'life' when it is most effective and capable in economic, ecological, and human terms." It is a very positive way to analyze and move forward with decision-making and creation of strategic change in congregations/communities.

It was voted that a new church be seated as full members of the NW Assembly, the Church of Steadfast Love, a mission development bilingual congregation of the ELCA located in Compass Housing Alliance in Seattle. Two Resolutions were passed regarding Eco-Reformation committing the NW Synod to participate with the ELCA in embracing practices of creation care throughout its life and mission. Two additional resolutions were passed which address the NW Synod's support of seeking a "just peace between Israel and Palestine".

I appreciated the opportunity to attend the Synod Assembly and to represent Our Savior Lutheran Church.

Report from delegate Maury Clark:

The 2015 Northwest Washington Synod Assembly theme spoke directly to an issue facing all congregations transitioning into new creation during today's rapidly changing social dynamics.

Bishop Unti reminded us that God gave each of his people one mouth, but two ears. Our Bishop suggested that perhaps God meant us to listen twice as intently to those whom we have encouraged to talk.
