



The Transition Team Today

Report to OSLC Council and Congregation

The Transition Team is—at last—seeing light at the end of the tunnel. Still meeting frequently and working together via multiple daily e-mails, we have completed all the questions and prose essays required by the Bishop's MSP (Ministry Site Profile), submitted the entire work to Council for their review, and are now working on incorporating comments made by the Council members. The revised version will pass Council's scrutiny one last time and, if necessary, the Transition Team will submit the final tweaks and polishing for approval at Council's next meeting on September 8th.

A Call Committee has been selected. The Transition Team will meet with this new committee to review all the work that has been done and assist with their orientation to the process. At that point, the Call Committee will work with the Bishop's office to begin their portion of the process.

Then we wait for the resumes of candidates suited to the church that we are and the church we aspire to be in the near future. The Call Committee will interview these candidates, select one and, if the call is accepted, will negotiate salary, benefits, etc.

We've been told by the Bishop's office that the process can easily take another six months after the Transition Team has completed its work. So hang tight. Hang in. And raise your prayers to heaven for a successful choice.

Safe Parking Update:

Our City of Issaquah permit for our Safe Parking permit was granted on August 17th. What can we expect now that our Safe Parking, six month pilot program for families who are homeless and must sleep in their cars, is a reality?

- We have alerted the agencies that will refer families and single women to us The Issaquah Food Bank, Issaquah Community Services, Congregations for the Homeless and the Issaquah Police Department, that we are open for business. We will keep these agencies up to date when our six parking spots have been filled and we are not able to accept new families. The license plates of our guests will be sent to the Issaquah Police Department so they know who has permission to stay in our parking lot.
- Kate and Les Gagnon, members of our congregation and both retired social workers, will conduct an intake interview with the families and run a criminal background check on anyone over 16. We will not accept anyone with an outstanding warrant and the police will be notified. If anyone is a sex offender, he/she will be turned away. Les and Kate report that the background check process, provided by our insurance company, is very quick and thorough. They also will be referring our guests to other social service agencies that can help the family address their challenges so that their lives can become stabilized.
- Safe Parking guests will be given a permit containing their license plate numbers to display in their car window. For the first few weeks, Brad Marx, a member of our congregation, will be checking to see that only registered guests use our parking lot. He will do this on an as-needed basis after that. He will need back up occasionally, so if you can volunteer for this job, please let us know. Our guests will also want to keep their families safe. As has been the case with other congregations, we expect that they will notify us if someone camps overnight in our parking lot that has not gone through the screening process and accepted as a guest. City of Issaquah Police will drive through to check, as well, when available.
- Guests will be required to agree to and sign a contract that spells out policies and rules that will serve to ensure the safety and success of the program. Violation of the rules will result in a loss of privileges or expulsion from the program. Periodic Sunday night suppers will be held in the church building to become acquainted with one another and resolve problems that may surface. We hope that members of the community, and our neighbors, will participate in these community building events. If you would like to help in providing one of these meals, please let us know.
- Guests will use the portable restroom that is now in our parking lot. It is handicapped accessible to accommodate a parent and child or an individual with mobility limitations. There is also a portable sink adjacent to the restroom for hand washing. We will also be collecting baby-wipes and handi-wipes for our guest to use.
- We hope that our Safe Parking guests, in addition to finding a safe place to stay, will become a part of our community by participating in our programs, ministries or worship opportunities, although this is not a requirement for participation in the program. *Please make them feel welcomed as honored guests of OSLC and beloved children of Christ.*

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Tools 4 School Drive:

Thanks to your generous contributions, our goal of \$1,000 was met. The money has already been sent to the Issaquah Schools Foundation for use in purchasing school supplies.

Mayors Month of Concern:

OSLC needs volunteers to collect donations of food and household essentials on Saturday, September 19th. Our church volunteers will be stationed at the Safeway on Gilman Boulevard. There is also a sign up sheet on the table in the narthex, or, you can contact Pastor Christensen if you can help.

Food and Clothing Collection Barrels:

Over the years OSLC has had food and clothing collection barrels in the hallway leading to the library. Currently there are two collection barrels for the Issaquah Food and Clothing Bank (IFCB). If you have unwanted clothing and/or nonperishable food items, they can be placed in these barrels and they will be delivered to IFCB by a member of the social concerns committee.


