## The Twelve Days of Christmas

Sisters and Brothers:

When I was in high school folk singing was all the rage. Folks like the "Kingston Trio," "Peter, Paul, and Mary," and the "Brothers Four" graced the airways and the record stores with their music. It was wonderful.

Burl Ives joined those others. He sang a song called, "The Twelve Days of Christmas." At first hearing it sounded marvelous. (After far too many renditions of the song I am no longer a fan.)

One of the things I did was to guess when to start counting those 12 days. Was it December 13? That seemed arbitrary, but even in my teen years I knew life is often that way.

It was much later that I discovered that Christmas was a season. It started on December 25 and went on for those "twelve days of Christmas."

You get "The Focus" on one of the days of Christmas. I hope you are keeping Christmas for the season. The Word of Christmas is too important to forget.

## Call Committee Update:



We have completed the first round of interviews and our goal to make a decision on whether we want to move forward with any of these candidates or receive a new set of candidates by the end of the year.

All of the candidates we receive come from the Bishop's office. The Assistant to the Bishop, Pastor Kathryn Buffum has met with us several times

to review what we are looking for in our new pastor. The work done by the Transition Team has been a key component of this. There is a selection and discernment process done by the Bishop's office to determine a set of candidates who are a potential match for us. For example, there has been strong feedback indicating we want someone who will make youth a priority, so they won't send us a candidate who has no interest in or history of working with youth.

The Synod guidelines require us to interview all of the candidates we receive within 30 days. We can receive up to five names at a time, but given the time constraints of interviewing all within 30 days, we felt three candidates was a reasonable number. Typically, the first round of interviews is done via Skype. If we choose to move forward with any candidates after a first interview, we have 45 days to complete second interviews and either issue a call or receive a new slate of candidates. If we release all of these candidates and receive more names from the Bishop's office, we CANNOT reconsider any of the first candidates.

The Call Committee is committed to finding the best person for our Lead Pastor. Please continue to pray for us and our candidates. Please feel free to contact any member of the Call Committee with questions on the process. Due to confidentiality concerns, we are not permitted to discuss any specific candidate.




#### **OSLC's Book Club**

Swatting Out Malaria

Thanks for being part of the <u>ELCA Malaria Campaign</u> that has helped in the efforts noted below. The "Campaign" has raised \$15.1 million over the past five years, Future ELCA efforts will continue through ELCA World Hunger.

Now for the "big picture" good news on Malaria. On Sept. 17, the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and the World Health Organization (WHO) announced that malaria deaths have dropped by 60% since 2000. This translates into 6.2 million lives saved over the past fifteen years. Over that same time, the death rate among children under five, who have historically made up more than two-thirds of all malaria deaths, fell by 65%. The sizeable drop in the death rate among children means an estimated 5.9 million children's lives have been saved. Furthermore, since 2000, the rate of new malaria cases has dropped by 37%.

The report "Achieving the malaria MDG target" maintains that the United Nation's goal to "have halted and begun to reverse the incidence" of malaria by 2015 has been met "convincingly." Since being named as a goal, funding for malaria treatment and interventions has increased twentyfold, to \$2.7 billion per year. Along with providing support for other forms of intervention, the increased funding has been used to distribute insecticide treated mosquito nets. The use of treated nets is credited with preventing 68% of malaria cases since 2000.

Increased funding also has helped expand the work of malaria programs that have distributed more than 1 billion mosquito nets in sub-Saharan Africa in the past 15 years alone. Despite the large number of nets in the region, many of the countries with high incidence and malaria death rates are in sub-Saharan Africa. So far in 2015, these countries accounted for 80% of malaria cases and 78% of malaria deaths globally.

Though we have come a long way in the fight against malaria, there were approximately 214 million new cases and about 438,000 malaria deaths in 2014. Even today, approximately 3.2 billion people – close to half of the world's population – are still at risk of malaria, a preventable and treatable disease.


