Call Committee Update:

The Call Committee had a bit of a break for the month of February as we were waiting for a new set of candidates from the Bishop's office. We met just once, but met with Pastor Christensen to review our criteria and come to a better understanding within the Call Committee of what we are looking for in our next pastor. We elected to increase the number of candidates we received from the Bishop's Office to five with the hope that this would both give us a better sense of the larger pool of pastors available and in-

crease the chance of finding our next pastor in this round. The process is prolonged by about three months each time we elect to receive more candidates from the Bishop's office.

This break has given us a chance to refresh and refocus as we are in the midst of another round of interviews. We received another slate of candidates from the Bishop's office at the beginning of March and are in the process of conducting initial Skype interviews with them. This is an exciting and diverse group of pastors and we look forward to talking with each of them.

SAFE PARKING:

We have submitted our application for an extension of the six- month pilot project permit to the City of Issaquah. It progressing without any concerns. We currently have two guests who find this respite from homelessness a blessing.

PASSAGE POINT:

Did you know that those leaving the criminal justice system are seven times more likely than others to become homeless? The goal of Passage Point is to provide parents who have been incarcerated, and who are being reunited with their children, to have a stable place to live, as well as parenting education and support, job counseling, training and other needed assistance, and within a year or so, permanent housing. Eight new families have moved into Passage Point this month, each needing bedding, dishes, pots and pans, towels and other necessary items to set up housekeeping. OSLC has been asked to assist these new residents as they move in. Four laundry baskets filled with these items have been delivered to date, and three more baskets are nearly complete. If you would like to help with this ministry, lists of needed items are in the cabinet to the right of the double outside doors in Anderson Hall. Once items are purchased, they can be placed back in that cabinet. Costco, Walmart, Big Lots, Ikea, the Dollar Store and Ross and good places to shop. Dear Friends,

The other day I saw a "catchy" book title, "God Told Me: Who to Marry, Where to Work, Which Car to Buy...And I'm Pretty Sure I'm Not Crazy," by Jim Samra. (Though intrigued, that is as far as it went.)



Patty and I love church planting with World Mission Prayer League in Peru. We are more than "intrigued," and have committed to a short-term trip to the northern Peruvian city of Talara, leaving on March 8th. We need your prayers as we go for these 3-4 weeks to survey this potential new area. We will specifically be investigating beginning an evangelical outreach, perhaps incorporating some type of English Language instruction. Pray for:

- New contacts within the city of Talara (120,000 people). It is located on the Pacific Ocean, on the western "bump" of South America.
- Pray that we would find significant local interest to "own" the vision. We would like to learn this area's needs, and build this into a broader evangelical response.
- We hope that this model of "Business as Mission" (English classes) can flourish.

In studying the Sermon on the Mount I came across this delightful quote by a theologian by the name of Manson, "**On the whole, it may be true that in his Sermon on the Mount Jesus gives direction, not directions; a compass, not a map**" (Manson). I find this helpful as we seek new direction in Northern Peru. We may not have "specific directions" but we do have "gospel" direction. Jesus Himself goes before us, and goes with us. As we proceed, with your sustained and focused prayers, we trust that hearts are being prepared. Many Christian workers are needed as there is much work to do, and the harvest is ripening.

Martin Luther in his sermons on the Sermon on the Mount (140), spoke up for the necessity and effectiveness of prayer meetings:

"Such prayer is a precious thing and a powerful defense against the devil and his assaults. For in it, all Christendom combines its forces with one accord; and the harder it prays, the more effective it is and the sooner it is heard.... Thus it is certain that whatever still stands and endures, whether it is in the spiritual or in the secular realm, is being preserved through prayer."
