Social Concerns Committee

The last few months saw the beginning of new social concerns ministries and the continuation of others:

- Lunch for the Break was again hosted by OSLC. Nearly 350 boxes of food were donated by members of our community and received by needy families in the Issaquah School District. Judi Case lead this effort for spring break on our behalf and, together with Lucy Acker, Bob Brezing, Ralph Case, Juli Bodell, Ken DeCamp, Cheryl Leiter, Sue Friddell, Les Gagnon, Don Robertson, Kathy Ziegler, Mark Mummy and Marshall and Mikey Inman, lots was accomplished. Great helpers indeed! We will rest awhile before taking this project up again prior to the Christmas Break. However, if you would like to help with the Issaquah Food and Clothing Bank's Summer Lunch Program, please feel free to donate food or funds. Bags of lunch fixings will be distributed at the Community Center lawn each week during the summer. We are also exploring the feasibility of "Issaquah Power Packs," a program to provide weekend food to the children most in need during the school year. Pilot programs are being planned for Liberty High School and Clark Elementary. If you are interested in participating in the development of this program, please contact me.
- Passage Point, the transitional housing program for parents who have been incarcerated and
 are being reunited with their children, has called on OSLC to help provide Welcome Baskets
 for new residents. These baskets contain the essentials to set up housekeeping and go with
 the families when they re-locate to permanent housing. Last month, members of our congregation provided supplies that helped eight families get settled into their new homes. Well
 done!!
- The City of Issaquah permit for our **Safe Parking Program** was renewed for another six months. In a meeting with the Chief of Police, we learned that no complaints have been received, and that while it has taken longer to get off the ground than we had anticipated, we are providing a safe place for two single women who would otherwise be in a more difficult situation. Thanks to Kate and Les Gagnon for their leadership in this ministry.
- Although the start of the next school year is a way off, planning for the Tools for Schools drive is underway. OSLC has again been asked to be a sponsor for this important program. Cash or checks contributed through OSLC and designated for Tools for Schools will help over 1,000 children in our Issaquah Community who need school supplies to start the year. Volunteers are also needed to help package the supplies, which are ordered in bulk. Let me know if you would like to help with this packaging project which will take place in July.
- OSLC has been called upon to help fill gaps in the **Community Meals Program** several times in the past couple of months. Some of the groups that have provided meals once per month over the years have dropped out due to the more restrictive food preparation requirements now being enforced. Members of our congregation have responded to the urgent, last minute requests for meals. Thanks to our members, we have both the kitchen and the experienced volunteers to respond on short notice. Our happy crew includes: chef Chuck Doty, Yumio Doty, Vicky Jacobson, Don and Lorna Robertson, Lucy Acker, Kathy Guthmiller, Judi Case, Colae Migge, Kathy Ziegler, Dianne Tanner, Jean Pass and Les and Kate Gagnon.

Chiclayo, Peru Scholarship Fund @ OSLC

The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Chiclayo (IELCH), in Chiclayo, Peru, consists of the three congregations of San Antonio, Las Brisas, and Las Lomas. OSLC has had an ongoing relationship with IELCH since our first youth mission trip in 2001. With our most recent youth mission trip in July 2014, these bonds are stronger than ever.

During our recent mission trip, Henrik Christopherson identified three young women in need of financial support for post-secondary education. These three young women – Miriam Gomez of San Antonio, Suzie Llantop of Las Lomas, and Priscilla Tirado Bensus of Las Brisas – are active in their congregations, and have interacted with OSLC mission trips since they were young girls in 2001.







Miriam, Suzie, and Priscilla are pictured from left to right above. Miriam is the daughter of Pastor Merci of San Antonio. She would like to earn a degree in Psychology. Suzie is the daughter of Pastor Harold of Las Lomas. She is halfway through a course in Accounting. Priscilla is the daughter of Rebecca Bensus, a pivotal figure in the Last Brisas congregation. Priscilla is as yet undecided on her area of study. All three of these young women were actively involved in our recent mission trip.

Beginning in January 2015, OSLC set up a Peru Scholarship Fund to sponsor each of these young women with a \$70 per month educational scholarship. This is the going rate for university studies in Chiclayo. For each student, this scholarship would be renewable in 2016 and 2017, if they continue in their studies. This represents a grand total of \$7560 over three years. We are very excited about getting this scholarship program going. It will serve to further strengthen the bonds between OSLC and IELCH, and it will give hope and opportunity to three deserving young women – and perhaps to other deserving students in the future!


