The name of the LORD is a strong tower; the righteous run into it and are safe. Proverbs 18:10

In the book of Proverbs we find wise sayings attributed to King Solomon. Growing up I neglected this book, however about the time Noah was born I began to explore it. It's not that I had never read it, or studied it. I had not digested it, and what I found was nothing short of amazing when I sat down with Proverbs. There were little one liners I could think about all day as I went about my business.

As I think about our summer at OSLC, Proverbs 18:10 comes to mind. Our Lord is a strong tower, and God has graciously watched over this congregation for a number of years. Most recently God has been guiding OSLC though this transition as I begin as your new Lead Pastor. One of my biggest learning this summer has been how pastoral transition is not congregational transformation. That is to say, conventional thinking believes the arrival of a new person, or group, signals transformation of the whole. But what has become so clear to me this summer is how that is not the way transformation works. **Transformation happens when people discern what God is doing in their lives, and where God is moving in the community**.

Brothers and Sisters the Lord is our strong tower, and in that tower we will always be safe. We have witnessed that to be true at OSLC. In the midst considerable transition in the past 2 years OSLC has remained faithful to God. **The question now before OSLC is: How will OSLC allow this transition to transform it and Issaquah?** Will you trust God is up to something? Will you trust God enough to follow wherever He leads? **Will you be a community that fearlessly follows Jesus?**



OSLC's Book Club


November 14th—7:30 p.m. & BOOK & Barnes and Noble Bookstore, Issaquah



My challenge is for you to consider - and then act upon! - how can you invite our children and youth to engage in the life of OSLC? The Youth Committee is inviting the youth to take a more active role in the youth committee. Wouldn't it be wonderful if it was run by youth and the

adults became their mentors? Or, if our next Youth Committee Chair was a youth?

This also doesn't have to be a big thing! A few weeks ago, Genevieve and I were impromptu ushers and I think many of you were just as charmed by her as she was by telling you when it was your turn to go up for communion. Henry likes to push the button to make coffee. What I see them learning is that they matter and they are doing something important. What better gift is there to give our children?
