### RMDs / IRA = OSLC

Are you over 70 1/2 and taking required minimum distributions (RMDs) from your Individual Retirement accounts? If so, you may get a tax break by donating to OSLC directly from your IRA account. A direct donation will count toward your RMD (up to \$100,000), and will not be added into taxable income on your tax return This is great news for those who don't itemize deductions since it essentially allows a deduction for your charitable contribution. Even if you itemize, there can still be many tax benefits, including lower tax on social security income, avoiding Medicare surcharges, and a lower overall tax rate. A tax professional can explain the advantages in your particular situation.

The OSLC general fund and the OSLC Mission Endowment Fund can both accept direct donations from IRA accounts. Your IRA administrator will need to initiate the donation. At OSLC, you can contact Wendy Winslow for information on donations to the general fund or Sandy Nygaard for the Mission Endowment fund.


