My four-year old daughter, Genevieve, asked me a while back how Jesus gets out of our heart. Though I suspect she meant it more literally than figuratively, it led to a nice conversation about how we show Jesus' love by the things we do—things like helping her young-

er brother Henry with things he can't quite do yet or playing with the new kid in her daycare class.

This also led me to think about the influence of our church community on the children who come through our doors, whether its once or every week. My husband Adam and I don't recall talking to Genevieve about Jesus being in our hearts, yet she has clearly learned it. We have all heard it takes a village to raise a child and OSLC is part of the village raising my children and many others. As a parent, I think a lot about the message I am sending my kids: are my words telling them the same thing as my actions?

I heard many times throughout the transition period and call process how important it is to our congregation to attract young families. Many of you expressed hope for a pastor with a young family. Pastor Wes, Emilee, Noah, Hannah and Micah are a tremendous asset to our church community, but it is ultimately the rest of us that welcome or deter young families. Kids in church inevitably brings noise in church—sometimes joyful, sometimes not. How are we responding to that noise? Are we wishing the kids would just go to the nursery so we could worship in peace? Are we silently judging the parents for not "controlling" their kids? What message are we sending?

Adam and I have felt, at times, that we have been on the receiving end of both sentiments. What if you were part of a young family visiting for the first time and felt like you were being judged negatively? Would you want to come back? What message are we sending?

I haven't yet met someone who said raising kids was the easiest thing they've ever done. How can we be supportive of the children in church and their families? How do we respond when a child inevitably makes noise in church? What if we told them how glad we are they are here, learning about God's love? What if we asked their parents if we could help in some way or offered some words of support? As Genevieve asked, how does Jesus get out of our heart? What message are we sending?

As many of you know, Genevieve went through the intensive feeding therapy program at Children's to have the feeding tube she had had since birth removed. During that time, she was on the prayer list, heard her name and asked about it. After we talked about what it means to have the prayers and support of your whole church family, she wanted to put her brother and cousin on the prayer list so they could have that, too. Our kids are always learning, even when they don't seem to be paying attention – what message are we sending?

# Engaging the Spiritual Practices of Lent and the Three Days

With The Rev. Dr. Samuel Torvend Sunday, March 5, 2017 3:00—5:30 p.m. Our Savior Lutheran Church

In this workshop, participants will consider a newer (but actually much older) understanding of Lent and how Luther's *Small Catechism* offers a model for engaging spiritual practices that lead to the renewal of Christian life at Easter. This is a practical workshop that will give participants a number of practices to consider as we move into the season of Lent that culminates in the Three Days. You can expect a well-organized, engaging, and thoughtful time to reflect on what matters in Christian life –

all touched with a wry sense of humor.

Dr. Samuel Torvend holds the University Chair in Lutheran Studies at PLU where he has been teaching for eighteen years. At the same time, he also serves as the associate for Adult Christian Formation at Christ Church in Tacoma. One of his most recent books touches on this workshop: *Flowing Water, Uncommon Birth: Christian Baptism in a post-Christian Culture* (Augsburg Fortress, 2011).





Checks can be made out to OSLC, with Social Concerns in the memo line, and we'll get it to the Food Bank for you. Food Boxes should be dropped off at OSLC by February 15th. We also need volunteers to help carry boxes on the afternoons of February 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>. If you can handle a little physical labor, we need you!!! All families in the Issaquah School District are eligible. You can register on the lunchforthebreak.com website.

Our turn for the Community Meals Program is always the second Tuesday of the month. February's meal will be on Valentine's Day. We could use some homemade Valentine's cookies. If you can help, please let me know. We are also short of volunteers to serve the meal on the even numbered months. Come join our happy crew as we have fun preparing and serving really good meals for the needy in our community.

The Social Concerns committee, which means all in the congregation who would like to work on the areas of food insecurity, homelessness and other issues related to social justice, will meet after church on March 12 in the "living room". Please join us! We will get an update on our on-going programs, like Safe Parking, Passage Point, the Community Meals Program and Lunch for the Break, as well as discuss new initiatives, like Compassion House. In addition to these items on the agenda, Brendan Rorem from Thrivent Financial for Lutherans, will be with us to talk about Thrivent Action Teams which provide seed money for teams that want to take on social concerns projects.

Passage Point, the supportive village that helps bring families together post incarceration, is having a resident's dinner on February 17th.
