A few years ago St. Andrew's Lutheran Church in Bellevue, went through the process of hiring a music director. During the search and selection process the music transition committee had the opportunity to get to know a few of the candidates.

As part of this team I enjoyed seeing how potential music directors would respond when I told them how much I love having kids in worship – *and* how I love it even more when I'm forced preach louder because kids are making a little noise. Some of the candidates would politely smile and nod at my remarks, while others would give me a look of horror.

Why do I feel this way? Is it because I'm the father of a young, active, and glowingly vocal kid? Nope. I've actually always felt this way, and it's for three important pastoral reasons:

- **Children are the future of the church, and we must pass on our faith** (see Hebrews 11 for an example). Let's fact it, if we don't have kids in the pews, we have no reason to expect that they will magically flock to the church as teenagers. I know this might ruffle a few feathers, but the fact that a child is making noise shouldn't concern folks as much as a sanctuary that is silent. The noise our kids make is the sound of the church growing. We should celebrate his holy noise and be grateful that someone cared enough to pass the faith on to them.
- **Faith comes through what is heard** (Romans 10:17). Paul is clear in his letter to the Romans: Faith comes through what is heard. If we are not having our kids sit in worship, are we not robbing them of a chance to hear the good news?
- **When we baptize kids we promise to take them to worship.** This is where it gets real. When these little ones were baptized, promises were made that they would be in worship, that they would be taught the Lord's Prayer, the creeds and the Ten Commandments. We have to ask ourselves if we are living up to the promises we made.

Keeping kids in worship is important. These three points just scratch the surface. My hope is that in reading this, you will think about why keeping kids in worship is important to you too.

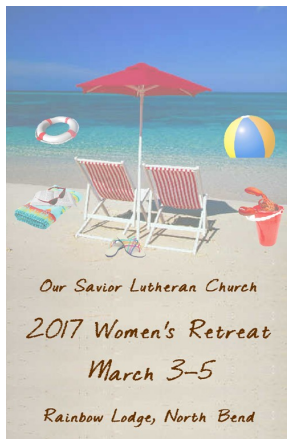

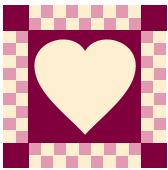

Many, many thanks to all our OSLC member who contributed so generously to our benevolences.

Thanks to you and many others in our community:

- Over 400 boxes of food, enough to last for a week, were given out to children in our community who would otherwise be hungry during Winter Break. This year, food was available to children in all Issaquah School District schools and through several new locations. In addition to the ample boxes of food, families were given small gift cards to grocery stores; free books, which some families used as Christmas gifts; coupons good for a pizza and salad donated by MOD Pizza; and their choice of passes to the Zoo, Aquarium or Community Center. Nearly half the boxes were handled by our OSLC volunteers and passed through Anderson Hall. Thanks to all who volunteered, contributed boxes of food, or money for the perishable items of bread, fruit and vegetables.
- \$1,800 was collected through the Giving Tree. \$1,000 was distributed to our OSLC families in need and the rest is being held in reserve for needs as they arise throughout the year. Members also contributed money to the Food Bank for the Holiday Gift Barn and/or volunteered to make this wonderful community event possible which benefitted over 1,000 community children. Another \$350 was donated to the Safe Parking Program and will be used to meet urgent needs as they arise.

OSLC members are involved in other ways, as well:

- Dianne Tanner continued her work with the Mariner's Wives to provide gifts for children at Vine Maple and for Families in Between.
- Judi and Ralph Case hosted a Holiday Dinner for residents of Tent City 4 here at OSLC.
- Chef Chuck Doty and the OSLC kitchen team provided a wonderful meal at the Community Hall for those in need, not only providing nourishment, but assurance that their lives are valued.

God's Work. Our Hands. Updates on OSLC's connections to Global Ministry

OSLC Global Mission Accompaniment to China

Retired from the service together with Pastor Jane Shen as ELCA Global Mission Regional Representatives in the Asia Pacific Region, Pastor Peter Shen continued as ELCA China Mission Consultant since 2005 until now. As a volunteer, Peter has been working closely with China Christian Council, the main body of Church in China, to build ministry relationships in the remote Southwestern Region of China and to enable and build social service capacity through collaboration between local government and churches. Through his active linkage to China Christian communities, OSLC Global Mission Ministry has been actively engaging in recent years this accompaniment relationship to China by sharing of faith stories, church visits and missional supports.

A mission grant in the amount of \$609 dollars, through donations of deceased OSLC member Mr. Jim Marshall, is now allocated by OSLC Global Mission Ministry to support the youth ministry of a newly formed New City Congregation located in Lijiang, Yunnan. During his planned visit to China in December 2016, Peter presented this OSLC gift to the New City Church and will bring back stories related to what God is doing in this land traditionally named Shangri-La.

Lijiang is located in northwest Yunnan province, joint of Yungui Plateau and Qinghai-Tibetan Plateau. Lijiang has a population 1.1 million of 11 ethnic groups, among which 120,000 are Lisu. Lisu is the third largest minority group in Lijiang. They mostly live in less-developed mountain ranges along the Jingsha River (source of Yang-Ze River) where the nature environment is harsh, lacking of basic transportation and communication facilities. These unfavorable conditions expose Lisu people in poverty, and make them impoverished population of Lijiang.

In 2004, ELCA started a tuition support program for elementary school children. This led to the ongoing Agriculture Comprehensive Development projects in Liming township of Yulong county since 2008. Implementations of these projects in the past years have yielded significant results, accelerated Lisu people's economic progress.

Concurrently with the ELCA World Hunger development programs, Peter has been focusing also the mission accompaniment with the Lisu Christian communities in leadership, teaching, evangelism and youth ministries. Four new churches and a modern Bible School have been built and functioning in spiritual and physical growth.

OSLC Global Mission Ministry is exploring the possibility for continuing/future ministry connections in Peru, Tanzania and China. We are praying and acting on our vision to fearlessly and faithfully follow Jesus in God's Kingdom of the world.

Update on Peru Scholarships

Beginning in January 2015, OSLC has been supporting three young women of Chiclayo with educational scholarships, in the amount of \$70 per month per student. The scholarships were designated for three calendar years, so that 2017 is the last year of the current program. The Global Missions Committee will be evaluating the program soon, deciding whether the program will be continued in 2018 and beyond, and, if so, what changes will be required.
