# **Social Concerns Committee**

Well, there is never a dull moment in the area of social concerns. Though our Lord has created this beautiful world with all of its miracles, we are aware that there is always much that he has left us to do as well. Indeed, sometimes it is overwhelming to think of all the people just in each of our own spheres of contact that need our help and our prayers.

As most of you know OSLC provides a hot dinner for anyone who wants it at the community center in Downtown Issaquah on the 2nd Tuesday of every month. Some of the recipients are homeless people. Some are low-income people and some are just community members. We have been so fortunate to have a faithful group of volunteers who most often are able shop for the food, to come in to the church and prepare the meal and serve it at the center. I wish to say thank you to those faithful volunteers. We are always looking for more volunteers to pitch in when these people are unable to do it. For example, in May our regular volunteers are not able to make it and Faith and Hope Circles will be taking on the job. In July, August and September we may need additional help as some of our usual crew will not be available. Please take some time to consider if this is something your small group or family could take on just one time. It is actually fun to cook together among friends!

On April 5th and 6th OSLC will once again be helping with the Lunch for the Break program. For those who don't already know, this is a collaborative effort between the Issaquah Public School System and the Issaquah Food and Clothing Bank and OSLC to gather from the community food for school children who are from low income families who may find it difficult to stretch their income for food over the vacation periods. For the most part these are children who would normally be at school receiving free or reduced cost lunches. In the past the program has provided boxes of food for over 200 children in this program. On the 5th of April the boxes will be packed with fresh fruits and vegetables and bread or tor-tillas. On the 6th families who have signed up in advance can come and pick up their boxes. We will have lists of specific food items that are needed available in the narthex or this list may be obtained by looking on the Issaquah Food and Clothing Bank website. We are always looking for volunteers to help us with these tasks.

On Sunday, March 12th we had the pleasure of meeting with Brendan Rorem from Thrivent Financial. It was interesting, for someone somewhat new to Lutheranism, to learn a little background about how Thrivent started and moved from the Lutheran Brotherhood (we've got the aprons) to being a Fortune 500 company. Many of us were excited to learn that any member (there were at least five members at the meeting) can apply for and receive \$250 in seed money for a project that would benefit the community. So many ideas came up. Everything from sleeping bags for our Safe Parking people, to yarn for our prayer shawls, to sheets for backing our quilts and money for mailing them to money for ingredients for cooking classes at Passage Point and more. The money is seed money so the expectation is that it will be used to put on an event or program (Christian Action) that will raise more money for the cause. As we were brainstorming ideas, it seemed like there were lots of ideas that would lead to lots of fellowship and fun. I think God will be smiling on us as we have fun and fellowship together!


