1 Peter 2:21

The time we spent exploring 1 Peter, during the liturgical season of Easter, was a time of great joy for me. I consider myself a lifelong learner, and 1 Peter was one of those letters I simply had not spent enough time digesting. By far the section that spoke to me most deeply was chapter two. The idea of a priesthood of all believers was touching. The conviction that all who are called, and self-identify, as Christians have been given a ministry was moving. And, of course, the challenge in identifying what God had called me to do was convicting.

As your pastor it left me pondering two important questions for our life as a community that is seeking to fearlessly follow Jesus. Am I an example, and am I leading in such a way, so as to show you how we all have a ministry from God? Furthermore, am I hindering the ministry God has given to you?

Too often, faith communities rally around one or two "personalities," and in the process they place those "personalities" in God's place. The necessity for communal discernment is an important balance in a faith community. Without it many communities fall into the trap of idolatry. Just ask the Israelites in the Old Testament when they asked God for a King. It didn't take to long before those Kings lead Israel astray.

I raise these questions, because as we begin summer I want you to spend time thinking about the ministry God is calling you to participate. It's my goal that OSLC isn't just fed spiritually, or intellectually, but also physically. I want you to be able to express your faith in word and deed. As things come to your mind please reach out and let me know. When we gather again in September for a new program year I want to increase the number of people actively engaged in ministry.

Treasurer's Update

April 2017

We have completed 10 months of the 2016/2017 fiscal year.

What has actually happened this year:

We have received YTD - (99% of budget) \$339,274.88

We have spent YTD - (94% of budget) \$322,598.87

Surplus: \$ 16,676.01

Compared to what we budgeted:

We are under budgeted giving by \$ (4,975.12)

We are under budgeted spending by \$ (20,832.79)

Compared to last year's actual giving, our contributions are \$40,664.78 below last year.

But when you give to the poor, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your giving will be in secret; and your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you. (Matthew 6:3-4)

For many people utilizing technology can be mysterious and even a secret. When the offering plate is passed around it can be difficult to remember the cash you would like to donate or to write a check on the spot, but E-giving will remove that unanticipated worry. As you are thinking of the best way to give your tithe you are encouraged to use both your left and right hand to type in and electronically send your donation. E-giving allows online donation and even keeps a tracking of your giving history kept for you to access in your profile. E-giving utilizes either your Checking or Savings account (need routing and account numbers), or by Credit Card (need card number, CVV number and expiration date).

Steps to utilize E-giving:

1. Go to: <http://www.oslcissaquah.org>
2. Click on the "Contribute to OSLC Now" button on the right side just under the banner.
3. Decide on a **One Time Donation** to donate once without ability to track donation history, or **Create Profile** for recurring giving and ability to track donation history.
 - A. To make a one time donation without tracking donation history simply fill out the form and click the "Process" button.
 - B. To create a profile for tracking E-giving history and/or do recurring giving click the "Create Profile" button-only extra step is a password creation.

Setting the Foundation Endowment Fund News

At our congregation meeting to authorize the formation of an endowment fund, Kirsten Olshausen, Parish Administrator of Phinney Ridge Lutheran Church (PRLC), and OSLC member, spoke regarding the benefits of an endowment fund. The Endowment Committee asked Kirsten to put her comments in writing, and she provided the statement below.

I have had the privilege of seeing what great variety of grants have been made possible with interest income from the PRLC Endowment Fund: Members of the congregation have been given partial scholarships to attend seminary; staff and members have been able to attend conferences to deepen their understanding in a particular ministry area, such as choral music, visual art in worship, or leadership in our class on baptismal living (The Way); numerous interested singers from the Youth Choir have been able to attend a summer class at Lutheran Summer Music over the last few years, thanks to partial scholarships.

I strongly believe that this is a very worthwhile undertaking and hope that those who have the means will contribute to this permanent secure asset for our church, so that in time similar pay-outs can be used that follow the particular guidelines and policies for the OSLC Endowment Fund.

We agree with Kirsten that an endowment fund is a worthwhile undertaking for OSLC. The operating document for OSLC specifies that endowment fund income can go to 1) youth programs and scholarships, 2) Outreach to the larger community, and 3) extraordinary programs/ministry initiatives that further the mission and ministry of OSLC.

As of May 15, the Endowment Fund has received \$1,925 toward its goal of \$10,000 by December 31, 2017. Please consider making a donation to the fund by noting 'Endowment fund' on your check or envelope. The fund also accepts donations of stock, and donations through IRA required minimum distributions. Wednesday Evenings, July 12th, 19th, and 26th

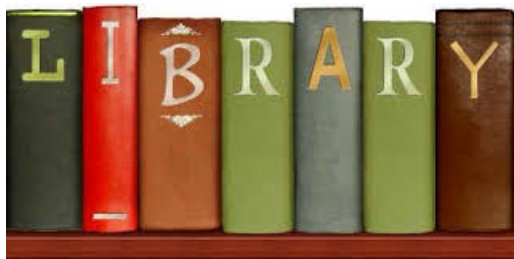
