The Wonder and Mystery of God's Grace

"But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ: By grace you have been saved."

Ephesians 2:4-5

One of the things I like best about being a pastor is the diversity of people I get to meet and spend time getting to know. Recently, for example, I spoke with a young man who shared with me his story of becoming a Christian as an adult. It was an amazing story centered upon God relentless grace.

As someone who grew up in the church, and never left, this story intrigued me. So often I take for granted the wonder and mystery of God's grace. Grace, from the Greek 'charis,' means favor and free gift. In this conversion story shared with me, the theme of unmerited favor kept reappearing. No matter what this person did God kept coming in his life. In response this young man was not focused on thinking the right way, but he was completely wrapped up in the gift God gave him. It has left me thinking how it would do me well to spend a little more time reflecting on God's grace in my own life.

So that's what I intend to do, and to help with this on Sunday's beginning July 9th until July 30th, we will focus on a sermon series entitled: GRACE. It will be a four week exploration of GRACE in Paul's letter to the Ephesians. 

OSLC's Social Concerns Committee

July/August 2017

Social Concerns continues to be an active committee year around. This summer we will be focusing on our collaborative effort with the Issaquah Food Bank and Issaquah School district to acquire "Tools for Schools". Though we have budgeted some our social concerns money to go for this purpose, we would be happy to receive more help with funds or if people can help with the actual dispersing of the backpacks. They are given to Issaquah students at the Eastridge Church on August 26th. The backpacks will be purchased by the food bank and



the cost is not known at this time. The contents of each backpack (the actual school supplies) costs about \$25.

At the time of this writing we only have one woman in Safe Parking but that is subject to change at any time. Last summer we were very busy.

The church council and the Social Concerns Committee continue to discuss the future of the preschool space. We have a general consensus that we would like to be able to offer this space to an Issaquah social service agency that shares our vision and values. We could rent it at a lower cost than comparable spaces would rent for in Issaquah. We have been checking on any tax or insurance implications for the church. It appears that we could rent it to a non profit agency with very little impact on our tax status or insurance costs. In terms of the insurance, costs could go up depending on how the space was actually used. If it were used as office space there would be no impact on our insurance costs while if it were used as a facility that needy people came to for services, costs would go up. These are all things to consider and input from the congregation is certainly sought in these decisions.

The Social Concerns committee has been working on the idea of offering a seminar to the congregation on the topic of adverse childhood experiences (ACEs). Research has shown that children experiencing a number of adverse experiences may have difficulty learning and developing in the traditional ways. It has even been found that ACEs can cause higher frequency of certain illnesses in adults. Adverse Childhood Experiences include such experiences as parents divorcing, a parent being imprisoned, parents using drugs, physical, emotional, and sexual abuse in childhood, and more. Many ACEs children have a combination of many of these adverse experiences. A seminar on this topic for the congregation would include experts in the field as speakers. We might also welcome outside community members. It is our hope that this seminar would lead to suggestions about ways that we as caring Christians might help children in our community.

It is my honor to serve on the church council and chair the Social Concerns Committee. If you have thoughts or questions about any of the activities mentioned above, please feel free to contact me.

A Thrivent Action Team Project with OSLC Members Passage Point Cooking Classes

On a sunny lazy day morning of summer, sleeping kids rolled out of bed, already bored (yes school has been out for a whopping two days!) Moms and dads, looking for entertainment, found the kids cooking class ready to spring into action. What could be more

fun than melting chocolate chips, chopping peanuts and mixing up Chinese noodles and making gooey no bake cookies? Well, to start with, each kid had a goody bag with an apron and a real—life chef's hat! The kids personalized their attire with special markers, and were ready to cook. While parents looked over the recipe booklet, the kids picked up their cooking spoons and marched to the microwave. Shouts of "they are melting!" and "can I stir?" echoed in the halls of Passage Point's D building. Working in teams, the kids followed the instructions of the leader and measured, mixed, chopped, crushed and otherwise created a beautiful, messy and crunchy batch of cookies. Next up was a word search puzzle, full of vegetable and fruit names. Covered in chocolate we decided to move on. Fruit kabobs were assembled in teams. Nonfat yogurt dip was made using honey and a little vanilla ("OOOH this smells so good!") A huge pile of berries and melons was reduced to pulp. Most fruit made it onto the sticks, but a lot went into tummies as eager kids wanted to taste their creations. Next up—the tortilla sandwich roll -up race! We shredded carrots, spread low fat cream cheese and topped each wrap with turkey and lettuce. No one had to tell these inquisitive kids that they could eat their projects—it was the only time there was a lull in the cacophony!

Thanks to the Thrivent Action Team grant, these kids learned about nutrition while having fun. Moms and dads got a bonus too—tips, tricks and lots of healthy recipes to make with their kids during the long summer break.

The idea of a kids cooking class came about from conversations I had with families at Passage Point one sunny afternoon as we sat on the lawn watching the kids play. Connecting these ideas to a project was natural. It was quite easy to apply for the Action Team grant. As a member of Thrivent, you simply log on and follow the instructions for requesting a grant. You will need to relate the intent of your project, and how it will help people. Core Christian values need to be incorporated. Once I completed the online application forms, I only waited two days before I received an email saying my project was approved. Thrivent can provide promotional materials, banners, posters and invitations as well as t-shirts and funds to get your project off to a good start. The 'seed money' helps with the expenses related to your project. I selected what I needed from the list, and a week later I received my package and a Visa card for \$250.00.

The kids and adults at Passage Point enjoyed the cooking classes, and I loved the fact that Thrivent is so committed to helping spread God's love through these Action Team grants. Many benefit from one simple action. So, get started today! It's easy!



Shelves of fiction telling fascinating tales are waiting, stories like *Until We Reach Home* by Lynn Austin (F-AUS), where three sisters from Sweden leave their troubles there to try to find a new life in Chicago or *The Centurion's Wife* by Davos Bunn and Janette Oke (F-BUN), the saga of events during the birth of Christianity. Not so interested in fiction? We have subjects such as parenting, marriage, biographies, Bible studies, ethics, world religion, Christian living, and more. And don't miss the "new additions" section just inside the library door. On top of that bookcase you'll find what you need to check out your choices.

And, most importantly, we can help you further your children's love for reading and keep their reading skills improving while school is not in session. Your middle school readers should find something they can enjoy in the Juvenile section (the books with the green stickers). 
