Coming out of these conversations the Council has asked the Social Concerns Committee to see whether any of our community partners might have the need for the space. Social Concerns, along with Council, is currently preparing a Request for Proposal (RFP) and will begin to talk with possible partners in the near future. The Life of Martin Luther **Adult Education Class** September 17 & 24 / October 1 & 8 8:45—9:30 a.m.



Setting the Lord's Table

Each week the Altar Guild prepares for communion. The bread and the wine (and wafers and juice) are placed on the altar. They are on dishes, but not the same dishes we have in the kitchen and use in the fellowship hall. These are special dishes that we call Communion Ware. A committee is in the process of selecting new Communion Ware to replace the worn pieces we use now. We expect to have them by the beginning of Advent. You may be interested in the names we use.

Communion Ware Definitions

Trays – the holders for the individual glasses
Cover and Base – Top and bottom of the stack of trays
Chalice – The common cup
Cruet or flagon – for wine or juice on the altar
Paten – the plate for the bread or wafers
Pyx – the small box that holds the gluten free wafers
Ciborium - container for storing the regular wafers



Social Concerns Committee

The Social Concerns committee has been busy over the summer. The Tools for Schools program, to which our church donated backpacks and money, distributed the backpacks on August 26th. It is always a very successful program and provides so much support to the community children in need. More information about this program is available at the Issaquah Food and Clothing Bank website.

We currently have two ladies in Safe Parking. Both have been middle class women who have had long careers, children and now find themselves homeless. Both are lovely people and it is my honor and pleasure to work with them.

Our faithful cooks continue to turn out wonderful meals for the needy at the Issaquah Meals Program.

Judi Case has written a request for proposals for use of the pre-school space and the council will meet to discuss and hopefully approve it. Next we will form a committee to read the proposals we receive and choose the most appropriate proposal. The committee will be comprised of some council members and social concerns committee members. It is hoped that we will be able to find a non-profit group that shares our values and visions and wants to utilize our space with low impact on the business of the church.




The Social Concerns committee is also preparing for more focus this coming fall on ACEs (Adverse Childhood Experiences). ACEs can cause changes in children's development that make it more difficult for children to function well in school and learn as other children learn. This is an area that the Issaquah Schools have been training their teachers in with the hope that teachers will gain more new skills in dealing with the children who come to school and may present problems due to their home environments. Adverse Childhood Experiences are experiences such as loss of a parent through

death, abandonment, addiction or imprisonment. ACEs are also experiences such as abuse in any of its forms and divorce. Many children are survivors of combinations of several of these experiences. The Social Concerns committee is interested in teaching more about this issue to our church community since many of us are actively volunteering to help many of these children in the outreach programs in which we participate. We are also hopeful that we, as a church, can further identify areas in our community where our volunteer efforts might serve this population of children. Don Burnett, M.Div. and Community Resource Coordinator at Passage Point, will be a guest pastor at OSLC on Sunday, October 15th. Following his sermon, we hope to have several workshops after church on several Sundays to learn more about ACEs.

Our knitters continue to needle away at prayer shawls. Please let me or Pastor Wes know if you know of anyone in the church who is going through a particularly difficult time and might be comforted by receiving a shawl that has been hand knit and prayed over by our Prayer Shawl Ministry participants.

As always, the Social Concerns committee welcomes new members and input from the congregation on any of the programs in which we participate. We feel a passion to serve "the least of these" as Jesus taught us to do. The intrinsic rewards that come from our work is amazing!!!

Being Willing to Try and Fail ... and Try Again By the Rev. B. Kirby Unti, NWWA Synod Bishop From The Spirit, September 2017

We are living in a time when change takes place so quickly that even the best laid plans can fail. One of my classic experiences of this reality took place when we did a \$1 million expansion at the church I was serving. The expansion included a new nursery - complete with sink and running water, separate play areas for infants and toddlers, as well as a crib and nursing rooms.

We were filled with pride and delight the day we opened the new nursery hoping it would send a clear message to families with young children that they were valued by the faith community. The truth was we were attracting young families and our Sunday school was bursting at the seams.

So, what went wrong? Two new trends were gaining traction. The first was an invention. The all-in-one baby carrier. You know, the bucket-like object that parents carry their babies in? The kind that also serves as a car seat and stroller seat. This allows a parent to remove their child from the car and carry them right into the church. Before long the worship space was filled with small children rocking in their bucket seats while the nursery was barely in use. The second trend that was unfolding was a growing comfort about nursing in public. Combine the two trends and the need for our state of the art nursery was greatly lessened. Should we have seen it coming? Could we have seen it coming? Perhaps, if we were really tuned in.

What we were tuned into was all the information about how important a state of the art nursery was to young families. The problem was by the time we completed our nursery based on the best current information the world around us had changed.

The truth is this is happening all over the world. Talk to Kodak about film, Blockbusters about video, Swiss watch makers, brick and mortar stores, and Ma & Pa Grocery Stores. All once successful enterprises, they have gone the way of the dinosaurs.

The Living Local Movement that our synod is engaged in takes adapting to change seriously. We believe that God is always up to something new. What we are trying to do by dwelling in God's word is to develop the eyes and ears to see how God is working in our day and time. "Behold I am doing something new. Do you not see it?"

Because we are never 100% sure what God is up to we must probe new ideas, new expressions of what it means to be church, new ways to share the gospel. It isn't that gospel that changes. What changes is how we engage it.

Back to the nursery, the lesson we were learning was in order to engage young families we needed to make worship "kid friendly." Welcoming the occasional cry of a baby is to embrace life. Young families often want a more hands-on experience in worship where they are able to worship God through mediums like music, art and dance. Children find joy in being involved in all aspects of the church. Soft toys and coloring pages representing images of the Bible Story can be a big hit.

And that "state of the art" nursery? What did we do with it? It continued to be modified and used by those for whom it was still of value. Today it is being remodeled one more time to respond to the growing needs of a population of children with special needs. It will once again be sacred space set aside to respond with love and support to the cry of God's children.

I want to encourage all our congregations to be more willing to TRY, FAIL and TRY AGAIN.
