One of my favorite pieces of art is that of the icon of the Nativity of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ pictured above. What I love about it is how it so beautifully depicts Jesus being born in a stable alone without a community there to support him. Maybe I shouldn't say alone because Mary and Joseph where there with him, but I think you get what I am trying to say.

Yet, while it depicts him alone it also shows the community he will change and how they will be changed. For me, it's a reminder that we cannot come to completely understand what it means that Jesus is Lord apart from the community which he founded, which is his body (1 Corinthians 12:12-14; Ephesians 4:1-16). In other words, the one for whom there was no place will provide you with an eternal home, and this home is experienced in the Church.

As we gather on Christmas Eve, welcoming those who have not been at OSLC for a while, I want to challenge you to remind them that they have been missed, that we have been praying for them, and that they will always have a home at OSLC.

I also want to challenge you to consider how we might continue to fearlessly follow Jesus by building our community at OSLC. Talk to someone you haven't met. Sit in a new seat during worship. Learn something new about a longtime friend.

The future of OSLC, and the Church, rests on how we build our sense of place, because the gift of Jesus' birth, and God's incarnation, is that we now always have a home.

President's Message:

I have found myself reflecting lately on the values we have determined are important to us: to be accessible, to be faithful to God's word, to be responsive to God's call, to be open to and inconvenienced by the Holy Spirit, and to build trusting relationships. I have an analytical mind and I like to be able to track progress, but these are not easily quantifiable things. How do you keep track of how accessible we are or how many trusting relationships are being formed? Conversely, how do we know what opportunities we are missing or how much progress we might be making? I don't think there can ever be a "good enough" level for these values and they are things we can always work on improving. I can't give you numbers for how we are doing on these things, but I can give you a few examples.

As you may recall, our nursery attendant resigned earlier this fall. This gave us an opportunity to re-examine how we are serving young children and their families on Sunday mornings. We concluded while the nursery space is important, there isn't currently a need to have a staffed nursery during worship. The nursery is used most often before and after worship, but not during. Young children often play there with their parents while their older siblings are in Sunday School, providing an opportunity for the kids and parents alike to lay the foundation for some of those trusting relationships. My kids and others know its a great place to play while their parents have a chance to participate in the coffee hour and fellowship after worship. In an effort to make worship more accessible for young kids and their families, we have expanded the small play space just outside of the sanctuary. Our hope is this will allow families to continue to feel included in worship as they are attending to the needs of their children.

Our Social Concerns committee is a wonderful example of some of our other values – namely, being responsive to God's call and being open to and inconvenienced by the Holy Spirit. They have provided us with several opportunities this fall to learn about Adverse Childhood Experiences and the lifelong effect they can have on people. This knowledge better prepares us to consider how we might meet some of their needs.

The Social Concerns committee has also been open to considering new ways to use the former preschool space. They have been working hard the past several months on preparing to partner with a currently unidentified service organization to use the ministry space we have available. OSLC has strong ties to several local service organizations, including Friends of Youth, the Issaquah Meal Program and Issaquah Community Services. My understanding is some of these were even housed here at some point. We have a wonderful opportunity before us to revisit and honor this legacy!

Your Guide to Year-end giving**
Presented by the endowment fund committee

In October, the endowment fund met its dual goals of receiving \$10,000 in 2017, and of receiving \$40,000 over the life of the fund. Does this mean we're done? Not at all. Growing the fund means more money available to further the future mission of OSLC.

Now is the time to review your 2017 charitable giving goals and make plans to achieve them. Planning ahead may allow you to leverage your giving in ways that will reduce your tax bill while benefiting OSLC. Everyone wins!

- **Donate appreciated stock held long-term**. You can deduct the value of the stock and avoid the capital gains tax on the appreciation. Keep in mind that your broker may need several days to facilitate a transfer. Calling your broker on December 31 may be too late for a 2017 deduction.
- Designate a portion (or all) of your IRA required minimum distributions. The amount donated will not be taxed. This is especially advantageous for those who don't itemize deductions and therefore can't otherwise deduct charitable donations.
- Consider a donor advised fund (DAF). A donation to a DAF is immediately tax deductible, but the donor can request charitable disbursements from the fund over time. This is a good vehicle for anyone who wants a 2017 charitable deduction but wants more time to decide where to give just remember to include OSLC. Your investment advisor can give you more information on these funds.
- Good old-fashioned checks and cash. Those who itemize can deduct their contributions on their tax returns. To give to the Endowment Fund, designate it on your envelope or the memo line of your check and put it in the offering plate or mail it to the church.

The above listing is focused on year-end planning, but also consider the many long-term opportunities such as naming OSLC as a life insurance or IRA beneficiary, a bequest in a will, or as a memorial. However you choose to do it, gifts to both the general fund and the Endowment fund of OSLC will further our vision of fearlessly following Jesus.

**Tax law could change before the end of the year or some methods may work better than others depending on individual circumstances. Contact your tax or investment advisor before implementing any of these techniques.

Bible Tuesday Morning Bible Join us! Study





OSLC Global Missions Committee Qingdao, China Report

God's work. Our hands.

OSLC has a rich tradition of global accompaniment and outreach. This brief report from Global Mission Committee highlights our partnership with an Autism Children Rehabilitation Center in the city of Qingdao, China. ELCA Global Mission (Pr. Peter Shen) initiated this community based ministry and guided the Center's development and growth since 2007.

"Honestly speaking, as an ordinary person, I often get angry and shout at my son," said one mother. "But here, they say we have to accept our children as who they are. I have totally changed." So now one mother is learning how to communicate with her son, how to raise him, even how to love him.

In 2015, recognized for its contribution to the community, Qingdao Autism Center was able to construct a new campus with grants and contributions from ELCA, government agencies, community organizations, and many individuals. The rehabilitation programs were greatly enhanced and expanded in this new facility.




Intense continuing education and professional training were implemented for a team of able special education teachers. The Center initiated and successfully developed the first interactive environmental simulation software as a teaching tool for teachers, parents and the autism rehabilitation community.

The Center has also constructed "Simulation Rooms" to provide realistic daily life situations encountered by the autism children. Efforts are made to provide intensive training for the parents. The Center is developing various activities to bring the children out in the public and to be seen in the community.



Youth in grades 1—12 or adults


Acolyte: Do you have a youngster in grades 1-12 who wonders what it would be like to wear a robe like Pastor Wes, light candles, collect offering, etc? Acolyting is a great way to be involved in the service without the risk of making mistakes. Anyone stable enough to light a candle, extinguish a

candle, and walk in a robe, is able to perform this role. Adults also welcome.

Story Time: Do you like engaging with the little ones? For youth in grades 8-12 and adults, who enjoy reading children's stories and entertaining young ones (toddlers-grade 2). After the Children's Sermon, take the willing wanderers outside the sanctuary to read them a few stories related to the sermon of the day, and engage them in light, easy conversation and play during the sermon. Twenty minutes later, return the lot to rejoin their parents. This may be performed alone or with a friend.

Sunday Morning Bible Readings: Do you enjoy reading? Youth ages 12 and older and adult may also get involved by volunteering to read the first and second lessons of the day on Sunday mornings. Text is provided in advance, and a microphone and material to read from. All you need to do is stand at the altar and read aloud the first and second lessons printed in the bulletin.
