As you may know, Encompass Northwest moved into the former preschool space at the beginning of June. We received the following message from Director of Pediatric Therapy Programs Kim Kanzler as they are beginning their work here:

"Encompass had our first gathering in the beautiful church preschool room, it was a huge hit!

Our first class focused on families that have a child identified with a hearing loss or deafness, We had 7 moms along with their children and they loved it. Our plan is to continue this group on the 3rd Friday of each month. We clearly tapped into a needed support for the community. One story of the day stood out, it fit the mission and values of both Encompass and OSLC! A new mom and her 10 week old baby attended the first playgroup. Her baby was diagnosed at birth with a hearing loss at birth. Mom reported that she was trying to figure out how to navigate this "new normal." She felt that the doctors just assumed that she knew these new terms, the different lingo, and what she needed to do to advocate for her baby. This made her feel inadequate. Being in this group of moms she instant felt empowered! She felt safe to ask this group questions and feels armed with information as she heads into her next round of medical appointments.



Eastside Fire & Rescue at OSLC

"Thank you again so much for allowing us to hold our interview process at OSLC - we are very grateful for you!" - Pam Bryson, Human Resource Analyst, Eastside Fire & Rescue

In June OSLC played host to Eastside Fire & Rescue (EF&R), where they conducted interviews in an effort to hire new fire fighter recruits that will eventually serve and protect our community and our region. Thank you to all the groups that moved their meetings and gatherings to other rooms within OSLC in order to accommodate this community effort, including the Mission Quilters, Nourishing Network, Overeaters Anonymous, Al Anon, and others!

Eastside Fire & Rescue invited 450 applicants to their initial screening interviews held at OSLC June 4th - 7th. The interview panels consisted of 3 firefighters and 3 fire lieutenants. They then invited 92 of those candidates back for second round panel interviews, held at OSLC on June 18th - 21st. The interview panels for the second round consisted of 5 firefighters and 3 fire captains.

22 candidates were invited to Fire Headquarters to interview with Battalion Chiefs, Deputy Chiefs, and finally the Fire Chief. 16 of those candidates have moved on and been placed on a hiring eligibility list.

After further background checks and exams, EF&R expects to hire 4 candidates on September 4. The new



fire fighter recruits will attend an in-house Ethical Leadership Academy, and then move on to attend a 14-week Fire Academy with recruits from other fire departments in our area. Following the fire academy, they will attend a 5-week Emergency Medical Technician course before being assigned to one of our 9 career fire stations.

Eastside Fire & Rescue serves the communities of: Issaquah, Sammamish, Carnation, May Valley, North Bend, Preston, Tiger Mountain., and the Wilderness Rim.

Sometimes I think summer is here, and I look outside only to see the pouring rain. Well thus is life in this beautiful place we call home. I wouldn't have it any other way. God has so richly blessed us with the lovely Northwest.

In May we held "Tuxes and Tiaras" in Anderson Hall. There were approximately 200 beautiful, gently used, prom dresses free for the asking on display, along with sparkly shoes, purses and a number of tuxedos for teenagers to take home for the prom. Volunteers from the Issaquah Food and Clothing Bank, School PTSA's, and OSLC set up dressing rooms and helped students find prom attire. All the students that came found dresses or tuxes that they were very happy with.



In conjunction with Pastor Wes' sermon series this summer we are asked to remember the poor. In fact, we already are asked each week at the close of the service by our worship assistant, to remember the poor. This summer it will take on specific shape by reminding us to bring in foods that are especially needed by the food bank. A "Corner of Blessing" has been set up in the narthex to receive the food. I remember one church we belonged to years ago where we just got into the habit. As we walked out the door of our home to go to church, we took a few cans off our shelves and took them with us. We kind of got to thinking of it as our ticket into church. We were going to church so we took a few cans of food and put it in the basket as we went into the sanctuary. A good habit that we didn't have to try to break.



This summer, as in many in the past, the social concerns committee will be helping with the Tools for Schools Program put on by the Issaquah Schools Foundation. You can help by bringing in new backpacks and placing them in the box in the narthex marked "Tools 4 Schools". If you prefer you can go to <u>https://supplyallkids.com/#/donate/isf</u>. From this website you can donate a supply kit, a backpack or both by just clicking a few keys. The donation dead-line is July 28th, 2018. Backpacks and supplies will be distributed at Clark Elementary School on August 1st and 2nd. Volunteer opportunities are available by contacting the Issaquah Food and Clothing Bank.

Also this summer the Issaquah Food and Clothing Bank will be offering a summer lunch program for children in need. The program will be on Thursdays through August 30 from 10am to

1pm. Families can pick up bags containing a weeks worth of breakfast, lunch, snacks, lunch meat/cheese and produce. The food bank is in need of kid friendly breakfast, lunch and snack foods, paper grocery bags, money volunteers to pack and distribute bags. To volunteer, please contact the food bank.

From the Global Missions Committee: Arusha Lutheran Medical Nursing Scholarships

The Global Missions Committee, on behalf of OSLC, recently donated \$9,750 to the Arusha Lutheran Medical Center (ALMC) Nurses Training Program. The donation was supported by OSLC Church Council, and then approved during the regular OSLC budget approval process.

A representative from Operation Bootstrap Africa called to thank OSLC for the donation. He stressed that Tanzania is experiencing a shortage of health care personnel, and the need to educate is paramount.

Additionally, the donation will change the lives of girls and families in the region. Napir Saip Mokoro described her experience: "I'm a second year student nurse at ALMC. In our Maasai tradition, female children don't go to school. Rather, when we are 15 years we are married whether we want to or not. But I thank God who made us all, that some other people of God consider us who are born in such poverty, and have given us the opportunity to alleviate our poverty through education."







OSLC Mission Quilters






OSLC's Book Club
