What is Reformation Sunday? Reformation Sunday, October 28th

If you're a new member or visitor to Our Savior, you may wonder, what is this day all about? For Lutherans and many other Protestants in America, the last Sunday in October is celebrated as Reformation Sunday. Reformation Sunday honors Martin Luther's bold action on October 31st, 1517. On that date Luther posted his statement of faith, known as

the 95 Theses, on the door of Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany, thus beginning the Protestant Reformation.

In some parts of Europe, Reformation Day is a civil holiday to commemorate the vast social and political change that resulted. Reformation Sunday in the United States is celebrated as a day to honor the root beliefs of Protestant Christianity: that faith in Christ is all that's needed for salvation, and the Bible is the true authority in matters of faith.

Psalm 90 admonishes us to do the unnatural: "Teach us to number our days that we might apply our hearts unto wisdom." We do everything to avoid the reality of our dying as Ernst Becker underscored in his prize winning book, The Denial of Death.

It is unnatural, maybe even frightening, for us to look at our dying boldly in the face with the prayer: teach me to learn from my dying how I might live with greater abundance. For this task we need the power of the Spirit, courage to face the conversation, and partners in our faith community who might help us.

The promise of Christ is that the abundant life awaits us even more than we would ever think. But, this also requires a "suffering under the cross" which, in this case, is the suffering of our dying and learning what we can, and making new and fresh decisions about living with our numbered days. Companions in Christ

A Small Group Experience in Spiritual Formation

Companions in Christ is a women's study group that meets weekly on Friday afternoons from 1:00-3:00 p.m. There are two primary components:

Individual reading, journaling and daily exercises throughout the week based on the Participant's Guide; and,

A weekly two-hour meeting based the week's materials and five daily exercises that help participants reflect on their lives in light of the chosen content.

An important part of this study is keeping a personal notebook or journal in which participants record reflections, prayers, and questions for later review/reference at the weekly group meeting. Knowing that God calls us to be a disciple of Jesus Christ, participants in this study do sign a covenant to worship regularly, take time for daily devotion, be an agent of God's justice and reconciliation in the world, practice love for all people and prayerfully plan the best use of time and resources.

Beginning sometime this fall, the Companions in Christ study group will begin *The Way of Grace*. The stories in each week's reading follow the chronological journey of Jesus' ministry as presented in John's Gospel. Group members are invited to explore and reflect on significant turning points, crises, and openings in their own spiritual journeys. While scripture provides the context for each chapter's theme, this is not a Bible study in any traditional sense. The group will focus on how these stories touch our hearts, move our wills, and shape our spirits to conform more fully to the life of Christ.
