From the Council President

I have been reflecting a lot lately about our vision: *To be a community that fearlessly follows Jesus to love God's people.* We remember the fearlessly following Jesus part and tend to overlook the rest. What does it mean to be a community? To me, a community is something to which you have a connection or a sense of belonging.

I recently read the book "The Culture Code," by Daniel Coyle and it pointed out it is most often the little things that affect how we feel around and interact with a particular group. These are things that are, most often, so mundane they are not remembered by the people doing them. I have been paying attention lately to the things people do that make me feel connected. Coyle calls these belonging cues and below are some of the particularly impactful things I've noticed people doing:

- **They remember your name.** A lot of people get my name wrong. The ones who make sure to get it right stand out.
- **Making introductions.** Sometimes this is recognizing someone is new and introducing yourself. Other times, it is making introductions between others.
- **They stop what they are doing to focus on you.** I have a neighbor who always invites me in when I stop by for something and always stops to have a conversation, however brief. I feel like she has welcomed me to the neighborhood more than I have her - only I've lived here four years longer than she has.
- **They assume the best of people.** We have all said things that just come out wrong. The people who don't make us feel stupid tend to be the ones we want to be around!
- **They listen intentionally.** People who truly listen are rare. Coyle points out interrupting with a witty comment is still interrupting and often has the effect of cutting off a conversation. I have found this a particularly difficult habit to break and it has given me appreciation for those who listen well.

My challenge to you is to pay attention to the belonging cues you are both sending and receiving. What can we do better? What am I missing from my list?

Training like this would not be successful without the support of our community partners. Your contribution to the Issaquah Police Department is greatly appreciated.

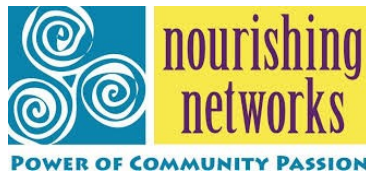
