As you may have heard, this past week was the ELCA Churchwide Assembly. One of the actions taken by the voting members was a decision for the ELCA to become a sanctuary denomination. Because of some questions concerning this, I wanted to let you know what this action means for you and for your congregation.

In its simplest form, becoming a sanctuary denomination means that the ELCA is publicly declaring that walking alongside immigrants and refugees is a matter of faith. Being a sanctuary denomination is about loving our neighbors.

While we may have different ideas about how to fix this broken system and may have different ways of loving our neighbors, our call to love our neighbor is central to our faith.

Of course, being a sanctuary denomination will look different in different contexts. It may mean providing space for people to live; providing financial and legal support to those who are working through the immigration system; hosting English as a Second Language (ESL) classes; marching as people of faith against the detention of children and families; having thoughtful conversations about what our faith says about immigration; or supporting other congregations and service providers. Whatever your local congregation decides to do, please note that we cannot mandate or direct our congregations and ministries to respond in specific ways. Each must work out what this means for you in your context. **Please understand that no congregation in the ELCA is being asked, expected, or required to break any law.**

As you will see from this memorial, the ELCA continues to support the work of Lutheran Immigration Refugee Service (LIRS); to advocate for fair treatment of migrants and refugees; and to work to close the child detention centers and end the practice of separating families from one another. These are all things Lutherans have been doing for as long as there have been Lutherans. Many congregations have refugee resettlement experiences in their past and many congregations support the work of LIRS. Our decades long work with immigrants and refugees is how we practice our faith in the world.

I am excited to continue the work that we have done as Lutherans since our beginning: loving God and loving our neighbor - the two greatest commandments.



OSLC Global Mission Support in Tanzania Arusha Luther School of Nursing

OSLC provides money for scholarship at the Arusha Lutheran School of Nursing (ALSN), Arusha, Tanzania. The school currently provides 1, 2 and 3 year nursing degrees. The program

began in rented facilities but learned accreditation requires ownership the school facilities. In order to maintain accreditation, ALSN entered into an arrangement with Ekenyewa Secondary School in Arusha to acquire the school's unused facilities and unused acreage for an expanded campus. The reconfigured facilities will accommodate dormitories, classrooms and a dining hall, and classrooms for specialized nursing education. The school's long-range goal is to also train technicians to operate and repair advanced medical technology.

Member Spotlight

Former State Board of Education Member Connie Fletcher Receives National Public Service Award



The National Association of State Boards of Education (NASBE) announced that former state education leader, Connie Fletcher, is a recipient of their 2019 Distinguished Service Award. Fletcher completed her second term on the Washington State Board of Education this year after serving for 10 years. Fletcher also served two terms as western area director on NASBE's board of directors and chaired the Government Affairs Committee.

During her tenure on the Washington State board, she focused on the accountability system and revising standards in math, social studies, English, and the arts. Under her direction, the board developed the High School and Beyond Plan to give students greater

flexibility in pursuing graduation paths aligned to their goals. She encouraged young people's civic engagement and service and took great pride in mentoring student board members.

"High standards and equity were key drivers of Connie's leadership on the board. She was instrumental in the major work of our state board over the past decade," said Washington state board chair Kevin Laverty. "She brought an exceptional understanding of the impact of state and national education policies on local school districts and students. She consistently kept students in focus, as well as the teachers and educators who work directly with students every day."

Fletcher has consulted for nonprofit organizations, municipalities, and school districts in good governance, planning, and major gifts fundraising. She served on the Issaquah School Board and was president of the Washington State Association School Directors Association. Under her leadership, the WSSDA published Closing the Achievement Gap, A Policy Action Guide for Washington State's School Directors, one of the first publications of its kind. She worked for the City of Seattle and for two United Way organizations and sits on several other boards.

Fletcher is one of three educational leaders being honored by NASBE for their contributions to education.


