As an Easter people we have been given "a new birth into the mercy he has given us through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead." 1 Peter 1:3.

As we travel the Easter season together remember "how he told you." Remember "how he told you" that you are the beloved of God. Remember "how he told you" you are forgiven, remember whose you are and who you are, God's Easter child. A blessed Easter season.

Special Congregational Meeting Recap



Our Savior Lutheran & Shepherd of the Hills Merger Vote Passed, Thanks be to God

At the special congregational meeting of Our Savior Lutheran Church held last month on Sunday, April 3rd, the vote to merge with Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church *passed* with a vote of 46 "yes" votes and zero "no" votes.

Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church also held a congregational meeting on Sunday, April 3rd, and their vote to merge with Our Savior passed with 19 "yes" votes, two "no" votes, and four abstentions.

Thank you to all who have met over the past several months to move this process forward. And thank you to all for your interest and participation to date in this important work in the life of our church.

Per the Agreement & Plan of Merger document, the **effective date** of the merger will be **Sunday**, **May 15**, **2022**.

From the Bishop:

I recently watched a documentary series that talked about bodies. In this documentary it was pointed out how in our society certain bodies are acceptable and "beautiful" (usually thin, young, female, white, etc.) and other bodies are not (usually fat, old, disabled, disfigured, etc.) One of the suggestions in this documentary to counteract society's shaming culture about bodies is to stand in front of a mirror and look at your body. And, as you look at your body, to name, out loud, the positive things that you see in the mirror. For five minutes.

Five. Minutes. This is a long time. And, to be honest, I have a much easier time naming my body's deficits than attributes. Perhaps you can relate to this.

I think that we have the same problem when it comes to "church bodies." Just as individual bodies are critiqued, church bodies are critiqued in this society, as well. A church body that has 800 bodies in it seems "sexier" than a church body that has 40 bodies in it. A church body that has younger bodies in it seems more attractive than a church body that has older bodies in it. A church body that has X, Y, or Z seems better than a church body that has R, P, or G (you fill in the letters). We have narrowed what it means to be beautiful and viable in the church much like we have with people in society - and if your particular context is different, it is easy to become tired and overwhelmed. It is easy to feel overlooked and shamed. It is easy, quite simply, to be discouraged.

But what if we expanded what it means to be the body of the church? What if – much like beauty standards need to do – we embraced a diversity of sizes and shapes? What if we truly incorporated what God does constantly – create and shape and grow and nurture a multitude of church bodies for the sake of the good news of Jesus?

I mean ... just as God never intended for the evergreen to be the only tree on earth (as beautiful as our state tree is), God never intended for one body to be the perfect body (as beautiful as each body is). The same goes for our church bodies. Think if we truly embraced the young and the old, the small and the large, the variety and multi-faceted ways of being church – including celebrating all that we do and are for the sake of the Gospel.

What if we listed all of the ministries that we participate in and that we partner with others outside of the church? What if we looked at the ministries that last a month or a year as important as those that last for decades? What if we said "yes" to ideas that seem different from what we've always done? What if we expanded church beyond worship on Sunday morning to ... what? What would you say? What do you envision? How is your imagination sparked through the Holy Spirit?

I encourage you to do the same exercise that is suggested from that documentary I mentioned above – only hold the mirror to our church body. What are you seeing and experiencing as attributes? What do you love about the church body that you participate in? What is beautiful? What formative experience is deep within you that you hold onto and would like to share with others? What do you see as a possibility beyond what you have been doing? What do you see as an obstacle that perhaps, upon closer inspection, could be a passageway? How has God gifted your community? Where is God's Spirit nudging you now?

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body – Jews or Greeks, enslaved or free – and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. 1 Corinthians 12:12-13

Lutheran Counseling Network Faith and Everyday Life May 2022

Psalm 139: 1-18

This psalm has special meaning in our family. It is a favorite of our son's birth mother. I can see why. It talks about how God created each of us



deliberately, and knows and loves each of us intimately. I can imagine that in the days leading up to her son's birth, it must have reassured her that he was no accident. It was God who knit him together in her womb. God created him on purpose, and had a plan for his life. This must have been so comforting as she prepared her heart for her adoption plan. She knew she wouldn't be there each day to see her birth son's life unfold. She had to trust that God had a purpose in mind for him, and would be watching over him, loving and guiding him, even when she couldn't.

The psalm has special meaning for me too, as an adoptive mother. It assures me that I am part of the plan for my son's life. Knowing God has created me to be just who I am has provided healing from the sadness of not being able to conceive. It assures me that my path is a good one. Knowing God loves me just as I am fills me with love I want to share. It fuels who I am as a mom. It helps me seek to know my son, to love him just as he is, to offer guidance and support. It also reminds me that ultimately, he is God's child, and that God will guide him when he's out on his own, beyond my influence.

This is true for each of us. God created each of us with love, just as we are. God has plans and a purpose for us. We are never beyond God's reach, or beyond God's loving care. We are never alone.
