## WELCOME TO OUR SAVIOR LUTHERAN CHURCH

We are honored you have chosen to worship with us today. Our Savior is a community that aspires to follow Jesus so that all may know of the love of God in Christ.

**FAMILY RESOURCES** At the sanctuary entrance there are books and clipboards with paper & crayons. Children are welcome to take these items into worship. Additionally, the family area just outside the sanctuary has full audio and a view of the service. There you will find toys, books, seating, and room to roam.

**COVID REMINDERS** We are privileged to be in worship with one another, a privilege we hope to maintain. **Masks are recommended in worship**, especially because of singing. This measure is especially important for vulnerable individuals among us.

Individual servings of bread & wine (red) or juice (white) await you; gluten-free bread is available. Communion will be distributed at the center aisle in front of the altar.

*Please be sensitive to physical distancing.* After consuming the elements, place the cup in the trays provided. To indicate that you would like to receive words of blessing instead of bread & wine, simply cross your arms over your chest.

Offerings may be left in the basket on the table at this time.

### **ABOUT THE LITURGICAL ARTS INSTALLATION: "50"**

The term *Pentecost* comes from a Greek word meaning "fiftieth." It refers to the festival celebrated on the fiftieth day after Passover. In Christian tradition, Pentecost represents fulfillment of the promise that Christ will baptize his followers with the Holy Spirit.

## **ISSAQUAH FOOD BANK FOOD DRIVES – 6 times per year.**

Responsibilities:

- Secure list of most-needed items from Issaquah Food and Clothing Bank website ([issaquahfoodbank.org](http://issaquahfoodbank.org)) and the dates for the donation drop-offs at the off-site warehouse located at 930 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue NW in Issaquah.
- Publicize the dates of the event and list the needed items in the Thursday update email and Sunday bulletin (email information to Cynthia @ [office@oslciissaquah.org](mailto:office@oslciissaquah.org)).
- Recruit 2 people to gather contributions from OSLC and deliver to the warehouse.

## **FOOD BANK ANNUAL COAT DRIVE**

Responsibilities:

- Collect new or gently used winter coats (teen size 14 and up and adult winter coats) for the November 3<sup>rd</sup> Winter Coat Event.
- Publicize the collection dates in the weekly Thursday update email and Sunday bulletin (email information to Cynthia @ [office@oslciissaquah.org](mailto:office@oslciissaquah.org)).
- Set up tables in the narthex for collection.
- Gather items and drop off on Sept. 16 from 9:30 to 12 p.m., Sept. 21 from 1-3:30 p.m., Oct. 14 from 11 to 1 p.m., or Oct. 19 from 1 to 3:30 at the off-site warehouse.

## **PASSAGE POINT WELCOME BASKETS – Once or twice a year, depending on need.**

Responsibilities:

- Contact Cheryl or Connie for the list of items needed for the baskets. Ask for the maximum that can be spent from the Community Outreach budget.
- Shop for designated items to fill each basket on the list from Walmart or other online source. Submit goldenrod receipt for reimbursement from the Community Outreach Fund.
- Recruit 2 others to help fill the baskets and deliver to Passage Point after calling ahead.

## **OCTOBER 21, 2023, MAYOR'S DAY OF CONCERN – Community Effort to Support the Food Bank**

Responsibilities:

- Pick up flyers and signs at the Issaquah Food Bank on Friday, October 20 between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. for use the following day.

- Recruit at least 2 to 3 volunteers to pass out flyers at grocery stores, encouraging the community to donate, and another 2 volunteers to load cars and shuttle the food to the warehouse from 10 to 2 p.m. Collect food and drop off at the IFCB off-site warehouse.
- Email Tiffany @ [tiffaney@issaquahfoodbank.org](mailto:tiffaney@issaquahfoodbank.org) and let her know if you prefer an Issaquah or Sammamish grocery store, and she will assign your group to one of the stores.
- Bring shopping bags, boxes, or crates to collect the donated food.

#### **TENT CITY 4**

##### **Responsibilities:**

- Once or twice a month, provide a meal for about 25 people.
- Organize the collection of needed supplies for the residents by publicizing the list of most needed items in the Thursday update email and Sunday bulletin (email information to Cynthia @ [office@oslcissaquah.org](mailto:office@oslcissaquah.org)).

#### **COMMUNITY MEALS PROGRAM**

##### **Responsibilities:**

- Plan the meal, shop for groceries, and lead a team of volunteers in the preparation for the Community Meal. Turn in receipts for the purchased food and complete a goldenrod reimbursement form. Confirm who will be available to help in the preparation and serving of the dinner.
- Serve as a member of the team that prepares a dinner for about 40 individuals on the second Tuesday or the third Thursday of each month.
- Provide a dessert for the meal and deliver it to the church.
- Transport and serve the meals at the Community Hall. Assist the CCS staff to tidy up the Hall after the meal is served.

#### **CHRISTMAS HOLIDAY GIFT DRIVES**

##### **Responsibilities:**

- Two Sundays prior to Thanksgiving, set up a small Thanksgiving tree with leaf tags to request \$25 gift cards from Fred Meyer, Target, Walmart, and Amazon for the Issaquah Food Bank's Holiday Gift Barn. The tree will be up for the last three Sundays in November.
- Before the first Sunday in December, set up a small Christmas tree display with gift card tags--usually \$25 gift cards from Fred Meyer, Target, McDonald's, and Safeway for those in need who come to the church office--as well as smaller denominations (\$10) from McDonald's and Starbucks for teens at Vine Maple Place. The tree will be up for the first three Sundays in December.
- Each Sunday, collect the gift cards and store them in the church office.

#### **ANNUAL GIFT DRIVES FOR TOOLS FOR SCHOOLS AND ISSAQUAH COMMUNITY SERVICES**

##### **Responsibilities:**

- Encourage members of the congregation to make monetary contributions to the Issaquah Schools Foundation for the Tools for Schools drive.
- Encourage members of the congregation to make monetary contributions to Issaquah Community Services to provide emergency aid to residents of the Issaquah School District in the form of utility payments and rent assistance.
