PRAYER OF THE DAY

WORD: GOD SPEAKS TO US IN SCRIPTURE READING, PREACHING, AND SONG.

FIRST READING Acts 6:1-7

¹ Now during those days, when the disciples were increasing in number, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution of food. ² And the twelve called together the whole community of the disciples and said, "It is not right that we should neglect the word of God in order to wait on tables. ³ Therefore, brothers and sisters, select from among yourselves seven men of good standing, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may appoint to this task, ⁴ while we, for our part, will devote ourselves to prayer and to serving the word." ⁵ What they said pleased the whole community, and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, together with Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus, a proselyte of Antioch. ⁶ They had these men stand before the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.

⁷ The word of God continued to spread; the number of the disciples increased greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests became obedient to the faith.

Death will be no more;


mourning and crying and pain will be no more,





Clergy Will Be Mandatory Reporters in Washington

On May 2, 2025, Governor Bob Ferguson signed Washington Senate Bill 5375 into law, designating clergy as mandatory reporters of suspected child abuse or neglect. The law requires clergy to report such suspicions to law enforcement or the Department of Children, Youth, and Families within 48 hours of becoming aware of the potential harm. Notably, this requirement applies even to disclosures made during confessions or counseling sessions. **The law will take effect on July 27, 2025.**

- **Mandatory Reporting:** Clergy members are now legally obligated to report suspected child abuse or neglect.
- **Scope:** This requirement includes any regularly licensed, accredited, or ordained minister, elder, or similarly positioned religious or spiritual leader.
- Confidentiality: Reporting is mandatory even for disclosures made during confessions or religious rites. However, clergy cannot be compelled to testify in court or criminal proceedings related to these cases.
- **Time Requirements:** Reports of suspected abuse or neglect must be filed within 48 hours of having reasonable cause to believe that a child has been harmed.
